FINE FARM TRACTOR.

An Overland Car With Great Possi-

After driving a 1912 Overland touring car more than twenty thousand miles over the rough roads of Saskatchewan, A. W. Bell, a native of Saskatoon, conceived the idea of putting it to work on his farm. His theory was that if the car could stand three years of travelling over the socalled roads of that section of the country, it could go a step better and do the practical work.

The Overland was converted into a tractor by the simple arrangement of putting in an extra axle under the frame, two feet in front of the rear axle of the car, on which were placed two binder wheels. After removing the rear wheels of his car, Bell replaced them with small sprocket wheels, which were connected with large sprockets on the drive wheels by a chain.
