GERMAN ARTILLERY

Will Be At Disadvantage In Russian Swampy Regions. London, Aug. 26.—In an enveloping movement against Brest-Litovsk, the engineering capacity of the Ger-mans will be strained to the utmost. They have just entered at Blesk and Vlodaya that immense swampy and heavily wooded region known as Po-lesia, which includes near Blesk the famous Bia-lowies forest, used by the Czars as a preserve for the vanishing European wild buffalo.

IN RESTRAINT OF TRADE

Eastman Kodak, Of Rochester, De-clared Illegal Monopoly. Buffalo, N.Y., Aug. 26.—The East-man Kodak Company, Rochester, is a monopoly in restraint of trade in violation of the Sherman anti-trust law, according to a decision handed down here late to-day by Judge John R. Hazel of the United States Dis-trict Court.

THE EXCHANGE PROBLEM.

London Times Suggests Lord Read-ing to Be Sent to New York. London, Aug. 26.—The Times in its city article corrects those news-papers which assume that Lord S. Akiba was the "ex-cabinet minis-ter" mentioned by the Times as hav-ing been suggested as one of Eng-land's envoys to be sent to New York to deal with the exchange problem. "Our reference," says the Times, "was to quite a different person from the ex-Chancellor of the Exchequer, and there can hardly be any objec-tion now to our saying that it was to Lord Reading. It, as we hope, it should be found that Lord Reading could be spared temporarily for such a mission as one of Sir Edward Hol-den's two principal associates, it will be generally agreed that he would carry with him to New York the full confidence of the city as well as of the Government.

SHOW OF WEALTH: ANCIENT FAILING.

Rev. Camden N. Coburn, Archaeo-logist, Speaks At Bible Con-ference. Winona Lake, Ind., Aug. 26.—The Apostle St. Paul was bowlegged and ostentatious show of wealth is an ancient failing, according to the Rev. Camden N. Coburn, archaeolo-gist of Allegheny College, speaker at the Bible conference, in session here.

According to the Rev. Mr. Coburn, the plutocrats at the time of the beginning of the Christian era had ele-phants, shorthorn, water-power, pipe organs, lived in flats, were confront-ed with trades unions, and spent more money entertaining than some of the swells at Newport. One an-cient epicure, he said, gave a dinner at which the fish course alone cost \$10 a plate; another spent \$35,000 for roses; another carpeted his ban-quet-room with \$200,000 worth of rugs. He said Ephesus had a li-brary that ought to make Andrew Carnegie fume with envy.

St. Paul, said the Rev. Mr. Co-burn, was married, "for which he could not more be blamed than for the fact that he was bowlegged," since only married men were allow-ed to vote in those times.

It may develop that the final series may decide the title this year, as Guelph plays in Ottawa on Sep-tember 5th and 6th, with two games on Labor Day. Guelph plays Lon-don and Brantford at home this week and meets Ottawa and Hamilton next week.
