There is abundant work for you and I do in this world to-day. There are opportunities which come to you and everyone every day. The great thing is to be ready when they come. God has given us certain gifts and He expects that we will use them. And He is not a hard task master. He will expect to receive in accordance to what you have been given.
"I have not much respect for the man who leads a religious life just because it pays him to be religious. And I have not much respect for the man who is religious because he is looking for a reward. Be good because it is good to be good and because Jesus wants you to be good. The man who simply does his work to get the day over, and never does more than that, will never amount to much. A man who has no higher ideal than this will never accomplish much. There is no credit to be given a man who does the easy thing. Self-sacrifice is needed.
"The life that has no sacrifice is no life. A man who shows no self-sacrifice, is simply like a machine that does the work expected of it, and then stops. And the man who does his work simply for the reward is not doing what is right. He will never amount to anything. He should be willing to use his talents to help others. People have talents and do not exercise them. It would be better if they would give their talents to other people who would make proper use of them. Some say they cannot preach and they cannot teach. Remember that there is a great deal of personal work to be done. And in carrying on this personal work God will bless you. Influence will do a great deal. I know people whose influence is greater than preaching and teaching. Many men and women have become great because of their influence.
"There is a place in the home for the woman. Her influence spreads from the home out into the world, and we can never gauge it. A man should be priest of his own household. There is a duty for him to perform. If he cannot do much work in the world, he has an example to set in the home.
"People have a mind, but they neglect to develop it. I consider that it is just as great a sin to neglect to develop the mind as it is to swear. There are men and women in the world who have never used their influence to turn a person to Christ. People have an idea that there is nothing for them to do and they go through the world doing as little as they can. They go through the world having as easy a time as possible."
