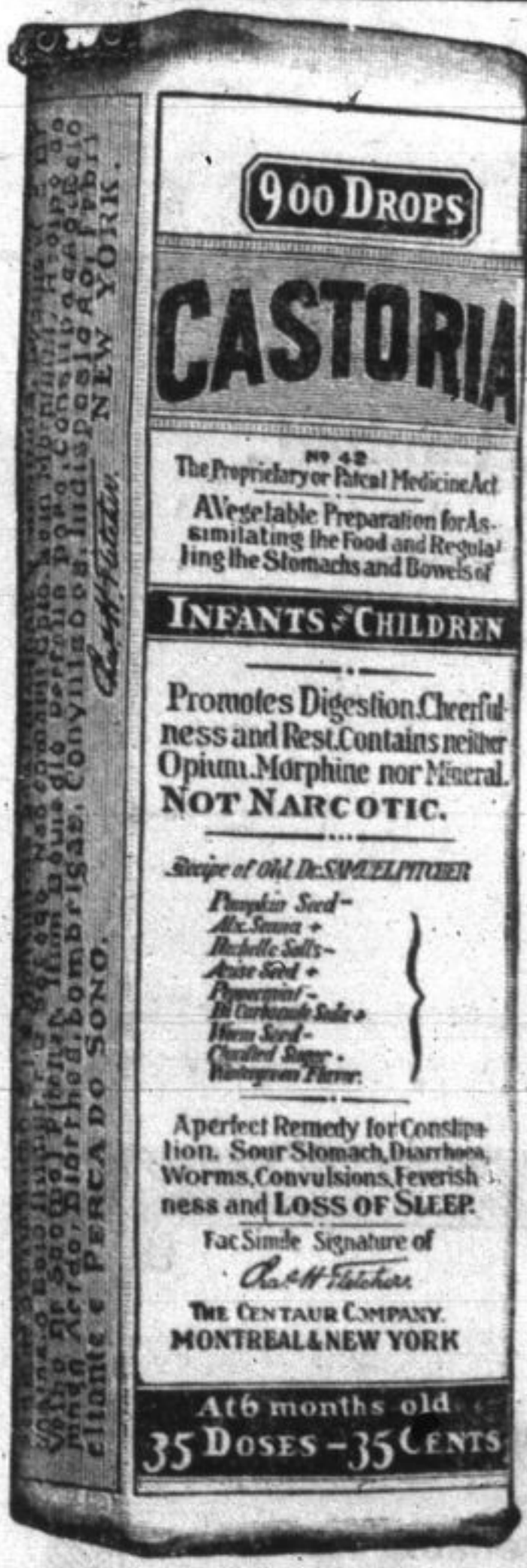

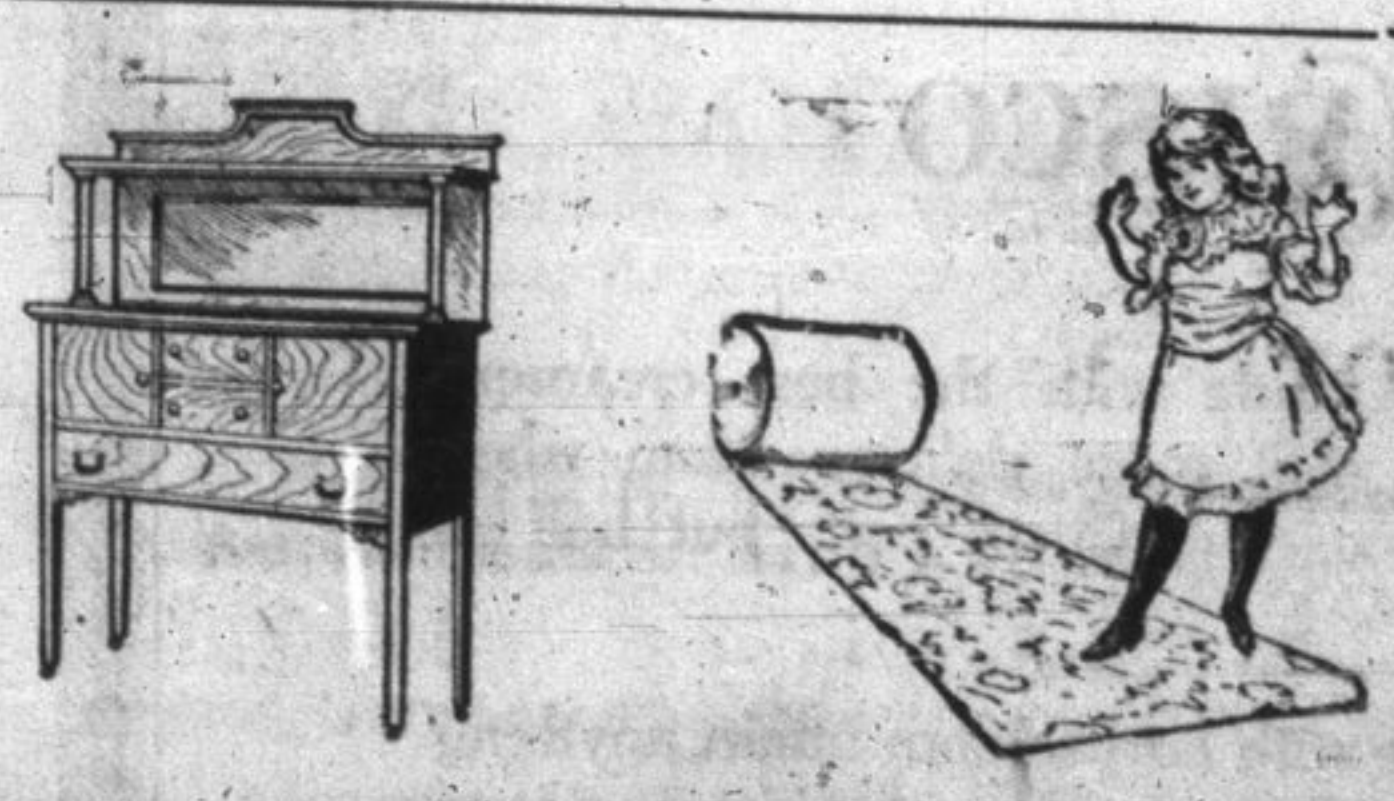

ON BARRIEFIELD HEIGHTS WITH THE OVERSEAS TROOPS

Although no definite word has been received from the Militia Department at Ottawa, it is generally believed that the 80th Battalion, which is now being mobilized at Barriefield Camp, will be billeted at some other place than Kingston during the winter months. Col. T. D. R. Hemming, when asked about the matter on Wednesday afternoon, stated that he was not in a position to say definitely what would be done, but he was almost certain that the 59th would stay in Kingston.

Few people realize the position that the Department at Ottawa faces when so many towns and cities are asking that some soldiers be quartered in them during the winter months. The three batteries mobilized at Barriefield will likely be quartered in Kingston this winter.

When one takes in consideration the number of soldiers who have been located in Kingston since the war was declared, the Limestone City has no "kick coming."

Captain James Stewart, son of Postmaster Stewart, who has recently returned from the firing line in France, will give a talk to non-commissioned officers and men of the 32nd, 33rd and 34th batteries at camp on Thursday afternoon. He will give the men some idea of what they must expect to put up with when they cross over, and also some experiences which the artillery brigade to which he was attached went through during the past months that he saw active service.

The 80th Battalion is gradually increasing in number. When the roll call was taken on Tuesday only thirty-four responded. Almost 150 men answered the roll call on Wednesday at six o'clock. On Wednesday afternoon about 125 men recruited at Smith's Falls, arrived in the city, and immediately went over to the camp grounds. After signing the necessary papers they were assigned to their quarters. The men who arrived on Wednesday were certainly a fine type. Most of them carried their belongings in valises. About fifteen of the 80th officers who have been accepted have commenced their duties.

Sergt. Franklin, formerly of the 39th Battalion, who is to be appointed battalion sergeant-major of the 80th, arrived on Wednesday. Sergt. Franklin, who has seen about twenty years of service, intended going overseas with the 39th Battalion, but was taken down with scarlet fever a few days before it sailed, and for that reason was compelled to remain in Canada.

Lieut.-Col. Ketcheson, officer in command of the 80th, when asked by the Whig about the bands, stated that he was not sure whether he would have both a band and a brass band, as it all depended on the gun who enlisted.

It is expected that about 125 men who have enlisted in Ottawa will arrive in the city on Thursday, and will be attached to the 80th.

Robert Aikin, of the Orillia Y. M. C. A., has arrived in the city, and will have charge of the religious work of the militia Y. M. C. A. Mr. Sweetman, who has looked after the work, has left for Ottawa, where he will conduct the Y. M. C. A. work for the 77th Battalion.

The library which has been introduced by the "Y" officials is greatly appreciated by the soldiers. Some of the books were donated from the different Carnegie libraries.

The C. P. R. telegraph service, run in connection with the "Y" work is a great attraction for the men.

About thirty-five provisional officers who will attend the Officers' Infantry Training Course which opened at the camp on Tuesday morning, had their first drill on Wednesday. A large number of the men have had little or no military training. It is expected by the end of the week about five of the officers attached to units intend taking the course to qualify for higher positions.

Since the Infantry Training School was opened at Barriefield about 150 men have qualified, which is certainly a credit to the 3rd Division.

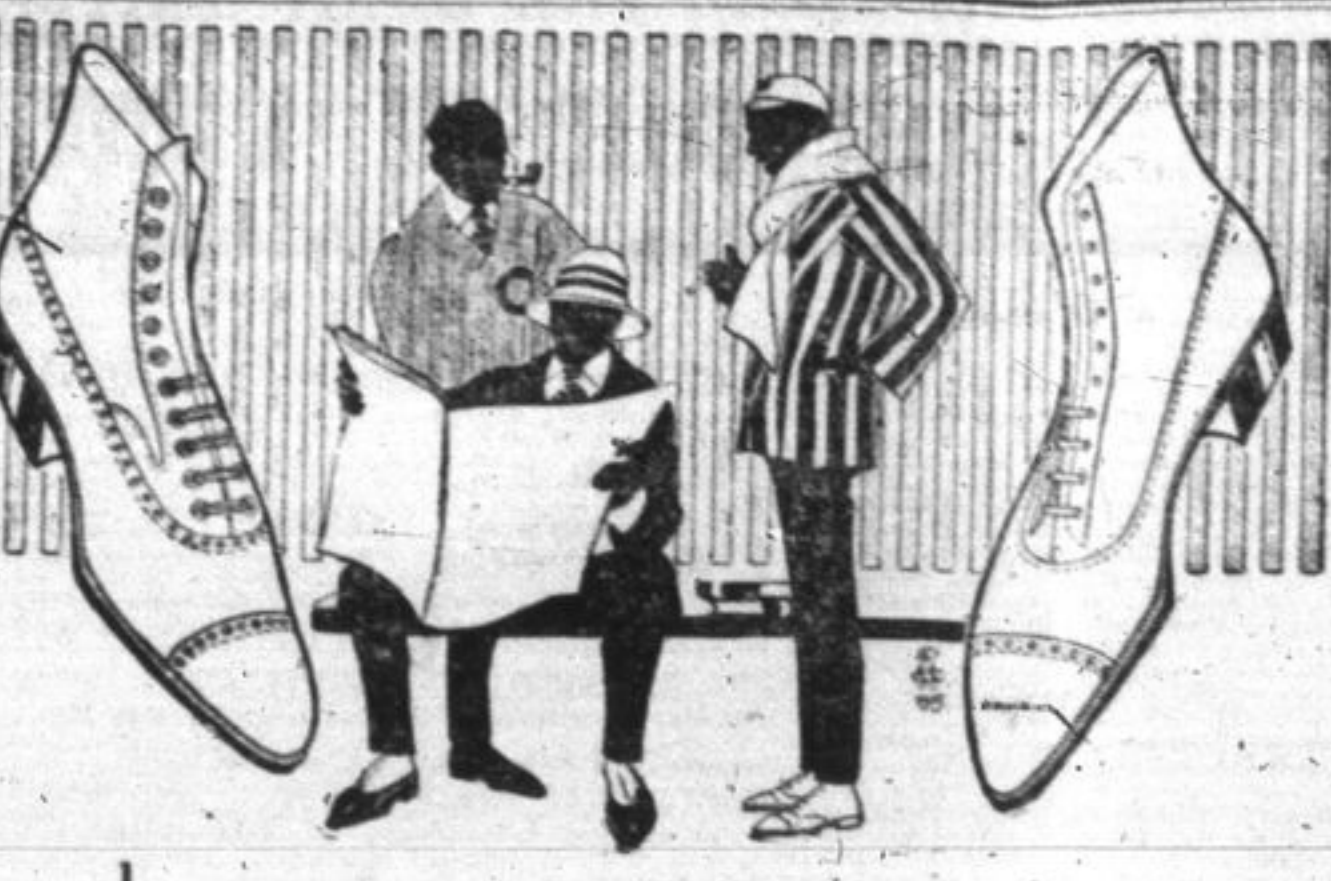
Some of the officers have not received their uniforms, and are drilling in their civilian clothes. The list of those in attendance will not be published until it is complete.
