Zurich, Sept. 13.—The Socialist Volksrecht publishes the text of a manifesto just issued by Austrian women of all classes protesting against the attempt being made in Austria and Germany to stir up a new campaign of hate.

Joins Royal Medical Corps.

Brockville, Sept. 13.—Word was received here that Dr. Norman Gilmore, son of the collector of Customs at this port, had taken out a commission with the Royal Army Medical Corps at London, England, holding the rank of lieutenant.

Carranza Refuses Peace Conference.

Vera Cruz Sept. 13.—General Venustiano Carranza, first chief of the Constitutional party, has declined to acquiesce in the invitation of the diplomatic representatives of the United States and the Latin-American countries that he join the leaders of the various factions in Mexico in an endeavor to bring about peace.

Villa Killed Again!

Washington, Sept. 13.—An unconfirmed and unofficial report from El Paso said General Francisco Villa was killed in an attack on the plantation of former Villista General Tomas Urbina, in Chihuahua.
