FOR A LONG STRUGGLE

Continent Next Year Than There At Present.

London, Sept. 15 .- Lord Kitchener has just presented to the Cabinet his estimate of the number of British troops it will be necessary to maintain on the continent next year, according to the parliamentary correspondent of the Daily Chronicle, who declares the estimate greatly exceeds the number already in the field, large as that is.

The correspondent adds that he has learned on indisputable authority that David Lloyd George, minister of munitions, who formerly was a supporter of the voluntary system of enlistment, now has become converted to compulsory service, not so much for military reasons as for industrial. He is said to believe the munitions problem can be settled in no other way since acceleration is impossible without a relaxation of all restrictive labor regulations and without utilization to a far greater extent of unskilled labor.
