KITCHENER PREPARING FOR A LONG STRUGGLE

Asks For Greater Number Men on Continent Next Year Than There At Present.

London, Sept. 15.—Lord Kitchener has just presented to the Cabinet his estimate of the number of British troops it will be necessary to maintain on the continent next year...

The correspondent adds that he has learned on indisputable authority that David Lloyd George, minister of munitions, who formerly was a supporter of the voluntary system of enlistment, now has become converted to compulsory service, not so much for military reasons as for industrial. He is said to believe the munitions problem can be settled in no other way since acceleration is impossible without a relaxation of all restrictive labor regulations and without utilization to a far greater extent of unskilled labor.

New York has 800,000 school children and more than 40,000 were placed on half time only. The greatest increase in attendance was registered in Brooklyn.
