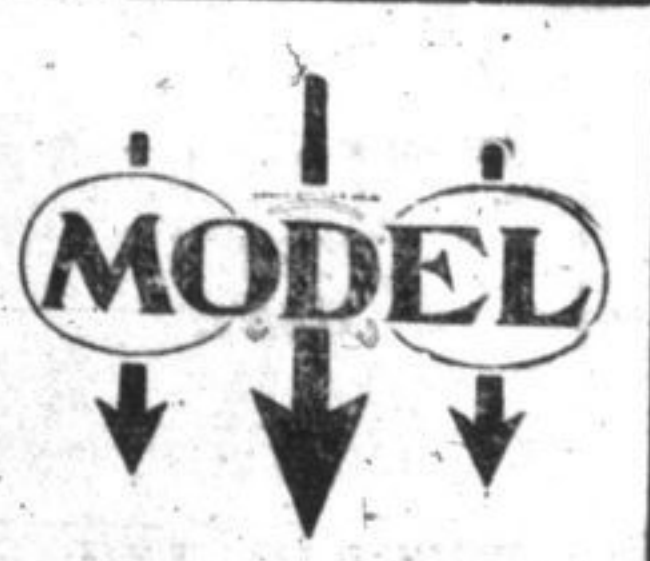

ALDERMEN KICK UP SHARP TILT BETWEEN GRAHAM AND HUGHES.

The Mayor Threatened to Put Ald. Graham Out—Council Sat Until Early This Morning.

The City Council was in session until 2.30 o'clock this morning, and it had an uproarious time. The meeting was specially called to deal with the incinerator by-law, but two hours and a half elapsed before the preliminaries were completed. The preliminaries consisted of a bunch of communications which aroused the fighting blood of some of the members. The Mayor was again the target of Ald. Graham's machine gun fire, but His Worship failed to be bowled out, keeping well entrenched. Once he threatened to make a charge upon the Victoria Ward representative when the latter absolutely refused to take his seat when ordered to.

"You'll do the right thing or you'll go out," declared the Mayor. "No you won't. You won't put me out," responded Ald. Graham, as he sat down. "I know my place, and just how to respect the chair, too."

Ald. Hughes was perhaps responsible for starting the fireworks. He likes to put one over on the Board of Works chairman now and then, and when he informed council that Ald. Graham had purchased a tank of tarvia from Brother Bliss, of Ottawa, without authority, there was a high old time, and much roaring from both sides. Ald. Hughes declared that tarvia was being plastered all over the roads, and the people were crying out against it. Last year \$2,140 had been expended upon it as an experiment, and so far this year the city had paid out \$2,532.91 for it. "The money has just been wasted," said Ald. Hughes.

Ald. Graham disagreed entirely with Ald. Hughes. He showed that the council had authorized the purchase of the tarvia.

The Mayor held that tarvia should not be put down except as a local improvement.

J. L. Whiting, K.C., had written council on behalf of a number of residents on upper Princess street, objecting to a levy being made for the tarvia treatment of roads. The city solicitor informed council that before tarvia was laid, local improvement by-laws should be passed, and this will be done in future.

Other Business.

The request of the Frontenac Coal and Lumber Company for permission to dredge out the slip at the east end of King street, where a nuisance existed, was referred to the Mayor, Ald. Graham and the city engineer for report.

By-laws were passed regarding the incinerator and the garbage inspector.

The roads were ordered to be oiled under the Local Improvement plan.

Ald. Nickle again got after the police, declaring that the traffic by-law was not being enforced.

James G. Dwyer making application to erect a verandah in front of House No. 78 Johnson street, encroaching three feet. Granted.

Secretary Board of Health regarding construction sewer in Bagot street.

Mayor Sutherland regarding the cleaning of Princess street on Saturday nights, regarding the erection of wire receptacles at corners.

G. W. Mahood calling attention to the condition of the walk on north side of Bagot street from Princess toward Brock street.

W. F. Kelly & Co., asking the privilege of installing a Boyser tank in the Market Square.

Khaki Club for soldiers asking free light in its building on Ontario street.

Convalescent Home asking for remission of taxes. Granted.

PITH OF THE NEWS.

Despatches From Near And Distant Places.

Gen. Tomas Urbina has been executed by Gen. Villa.

Carranza forces have defeated bandits in three battles in the last three days between Orizaba and Vera Cruz.

Jack Cohen, pugilist, is in a new York hospital in a state of collapse from blood poisoning. Cohen was "knocked out" by a mosquito bite while training.

Pneumonia caused the death recently of William T. Goy, New York, aged fifty-five years, known in show for years as the legless and armless wonder.

At Great Bend, N.Y., the Woolworth Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church, erected by Frank W. Woolworth, a native of Great Bend, was dedicated this week.

According to the Copenhagen Politiken, Dr. Dumba, the Austrian Ambassador to the United States, will sail on the steamer Frederick VIII. from New York on September 22nd for Copenhagen.

Hon. Edward Brown, new Provincial Treasurer of Manitoba, is in Montreal, where it is understood he will endeavor to arrange for a loan for Manitoba on the Manitoba Parliament. The contract is to be re-let shortly.

Edward Ledwidge, an official of the Mexican North-Western Railroad, who has been held for \$10,000 ransom by bandits operating near the Cambre Tunnel, in Chinahuatl, was released on Tuesday, according to information reaching El Paso. A posse is pursuing the bandits.

The Government has paid the sum of \$5,500 to the widow of Antoine Notter, the French reservist who was shot and killed by Sergeant Hooten in front of the Craig Street Armoury, Montreal, last autumn. Sergeant Hooten was on guard duty, and Notter, it appears, did not understand his order to keep back.

STOPPING NEWSPAPERS

To Prevent Them Giving Information To Enemy.

London, Sept. 15.—The Daily Mail says: "Those who are addressing copies of newspaper to friends in neutral countries, whether on the continent or in America, are now finding that the Post-office is refusing to forward them. No newspaper or magazine sent by an individual is allowed to leave the country, to such addresses. There is, however, one way still left open by the authorities, who will allow newspapers to go, through the mails if despatched from the offices of publishers or their agents. The idea underlying the Postoffice prohibition is to prevent an individual newspaper being marked or coded so as to give information to the enemy."

AN ARSON SYNDICATE.

St. Louis Police Say They Have Uncovered One There.

St. Louis, Mo., Sept. 15.—Insurance agents, human torches, and unnamed "prominent" business men, comprised the personnel of an arson syndicate, the police say they uncovered in St. Louis Monday night.

These incendiaries, the police say, were responsible for most of the big fires which have baffled fire and police departments in St. Louis for five years, and the profits of the arson syndicate, the police declare, ran into millions of dollars.

One insurance agent and four "torches" were arrested, the latter being rapped yesterday as they were about to carry four barrels of gasoline into the Christen Bellows Company's plant, which they are said to have made arrangements to burn, the owner having agreed to the plan at the direction of the police.

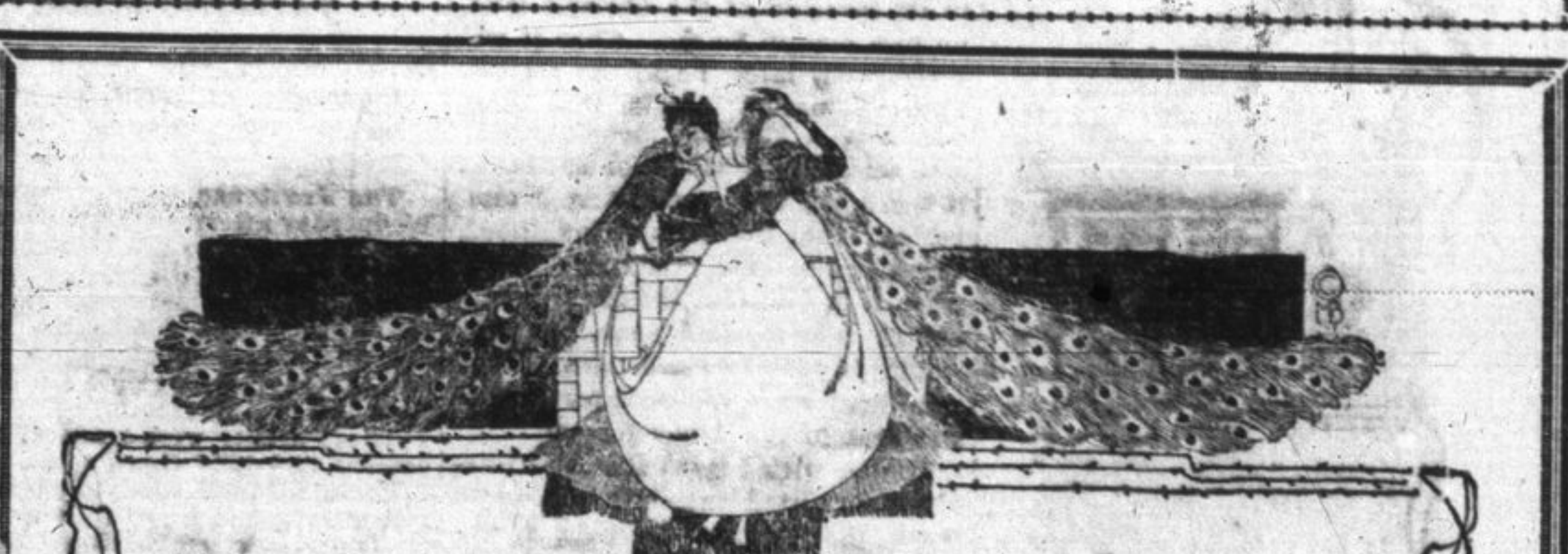
