A GLUT OF GARBAGE

TOWN WILL FIRST HAVE TO BE CLEANED UP.

Of the Accumulated Garbage Before the Regular System Can Start—Inspector Timmerman on the Job.

A meeting of the City Council's new Garbage Collection Committee, consisting of Aids, Wright, Richardson and Litton, is to be held this evening to work out the details for the forthcoming collection, which is to start within a week. Police Constable Nicholas Timmerman has accepted the position of inspector, tendered him by the City Council, and will confer with the committee. Inspector Timmerman will recommend that as many horses and wagons as can be got be engaged temporarily for the collection. He says that Kingston is just glutted with garbage, owing to the unsatisfactory system of collection that has been in vogue, and it is absolutely necessary that the glut be relieved. When the accumulated garbage has all been collected, then the regular collection can be proceeded with.

Civic Finance Committee.
A special meeting of the Civic Finance Committee was held on Thursday afternoon, when the request of the Soldiers' Khaki Club for free light was granted.

The committee decided that it could not make any grant to the Kingston Industrial Agricultural Association for repairs to the Fair Grounds buildings.

A SPLENDID PERFORMANCE

Was Given in Opera House in Presenting "Tribby."
