A CANADIAN'S RUDE. How an Alien Was Trapped by Lance-Corp. Stanley. The smartness and tact of a Canadian serving in the Gloucestershire Regiment were responsible for the arrest of a dangerous German named Carl Heinrich Amundus, 21, who was charged, at Bristol, with failing to register as an alien, with attempting to elicit information regarding troops' movements, and dispositions, and with passing under an assumed name. Lance-Corporal J. Stanley, a Canadian who joined the Gloucestershire Regiment at Bristol, said he met Amundus at Bristol, and after some conversation Amundus said, 'I am sorry to see you in that uniform, because the Germans are sure to win in the end, and you'll make nothing.' Stanley encouraged him to talk, and Amundus added that he was born in Hamburg, that he had been trained in the German Army, that he was an officer, that he had sent two messages containing information to Germany by way of the U. S. and Norway, and that since his letter had gone six ships had been torpedoed in the Bristol Channel. He added that he had tried to poison 400 horses. To lead him on Stanley asked if there was anything he could do for Germany. Amundus said that information as to the date troopships left, and the number of drafts going to the front from camp would be useful. It was further stated that prisoner left Hamburg on July 23, and went to Boston, U.S.A. After some months he shipped as a trimmer on the steamer Artemus, bound for Gothenburg. The vessel was stopped by a British cruiser as a carrier of contraband, and brought to Avonmouth. Amundus obtained a military pass to the docks where in the name of Charles Stephens, and the prosecution contended that he would be able to despatch by ships messages which would be free from censorship. The prisoner, in evidence, said he had told Stanley lies. He was too young and medically unfit for the German Army. He was not a spy, and had done nothing against Britain. He was sentenced to six months' hard labor and certified for deportation.

Trade Under War Conditions. War sticks out prominently in the array of figures showing the trade of Canada for the twelve months ended March, 1915, as compared with trade for the same months in former years. It is shown that for 1915 the duty collected in Canada amounted to \$79,183,489. Although this is a notable decrease from 1914 and 1913, it must be remembered that those years were somewhat abnormal. They were, to an extent at least, boom years. The articles that came into Canada were made up of luxuries and necessities.

The Unwritten Law. 'E was jolly bryve, our captivity, a wounded Tommy told me. 'E always syde dahn' nothink but wying whar mad for us chaps' nerves. So when Ayer was dull in the trenches, 'e was an' stand right out in front of us and walk up an' down syde an' 'e was as strollin' along Pull Mall, W'y, 'e did it five or six times before the Germans killed 'im. I made no comment, but I did permit myself a question. 'Didn't 'e know 'e was dangerous?' 'I asked, 'The Tommy eyed me with suppre scorn. 'Know it was dangerous?' he repeated. 'E knew it was fytal; that's what 'e knew. A man close to the War Office confirmed the impression that 'I have here tried to convey. 'We can't get them to give it up,' he said. 'It's killing them by the hundreds and hundreds. We'll feel the officer families before we feel the ammunition families. To see them at it, you would think they were rather die than live. We give orders, but they consider this sort of thing the unwritten law, you know.'

At Harrieheld Camp. Rumor that the 8th C.M.R. man arrested Thursday for desertion is a spy is being investigated. The Jews in camp are given permission to attend their New Year services in the Kingston Synagogue on Friday and Saturday. Toronto hotelkeepers are unlikely to refuse to sell liquor to soldiers. Italians Aid in Gallipoli Operations. New York, Sept. 16.—The Progresso-Italo-Americano prints a despatch from its Paris correspondent this morning, saying that the latter has heard through a despatch from Athens that the troops just disembarked on the north side of the Gulf of Saros are composed of English and Italians, and adds: 'The operation is proceeding with the greatest order, despatch and secrecy. The object of the Allies is to cut off the Ottoman troops operating in the west of the Peninsula of Gallipoli and possibly to act against Bulgaria with the co-operation of Romania, should the former decide to join the Turks and the Central Empires. Besides this, the Allies intend to deal a decisive blow to the enemy and capture Constantinople before winter.'
