A CANADIAN'S RUSE.

How an Alien Was Trapped by Lance-Corp. Stanley.

The smartness and tact of a Canadian serving in the Gloucestershire Regiment were responsible for the arrest of a dangerous German named Carl Heinrich Amundus, 21, who was charged, at Bristol, with failing to --- register as an alien, with attempting to elicit information regarding troops' movements, and dispositions, and with passing under an assumed

Lance-Corporal J. Stanley, a Canadian who joined the Gloucestershire Regiment at Bristol, said he met Amundus at Bristol, and after some conversation Amundus said, "I am sorry to see you in that uniform, because the Germans are sure to win in the end, and you'll make nothing." Stanley encouraged him to talk, and Amundus added that he was born in Hamburg, that he had been trained the German Army, that he was an officer, that he had sent two messages containing information to Germany by way of the U. S. and Norway, and that since his letter had gone six ships had been torpedoed in the Bristol Channel. He added that he had tried to poison 100 horses. To lead im on Stanley asked if there was anything he could do for Germany. Amundus said that Information as to the date troopships left, and the number of drafts going to the front from camp would be useful.

It was further stated that prisoner left Hamburg on July 29, 1914, and went to Boston, U.S.A. After some months he shipped as a trimmer on the steamer Artemus, bound Gothenburg. The vessel was stopped a British cruiser as a carrier of contraband; and brought to Avonmouth. Amundus obtained a milltary pass to the docks made out in the name of Charles Stephens, and the prosecution contended that he would be able to despatch by ships messages which would be free from censorship. The prisoner, in evideuce, said he had told Stanley lies. He was too young and medically unfit for the German army. He was not a spy, and had done nothing against Britain. He was sentenced to six months' hard labor and certified for deportation.

140 tuxuries paid a high duty. may be well to compare the 1915 duties collected with those of the year 1912. In that year duties amounted to \$87,548,536, so that the decrease is less than \$9,000,000. These figures should be considered in view of the determination of the Government to impose war taxes to bring up the falling revenues. There is no reason why, even without war conditions, the revenues of 1915 (for the fiscal year ended March) should even approximate those for 1913 and 1914. In no other department of Canadian affairs does business come up to that of those years.

The total of imports into Canada, both free and dutiable, for 1915 was \$445,371,371, as compared with \$618,328,874 in 1914, and with \$521,348,701 in 1912. There has thus been a great decrease from last year, and a considerable decrease from the year 1912.
