**ON BARRIEFIELD HEIGHTS  
WITH THE OVERSEAS TROOPS**

The officers of the camp are protesting against the condition of the road to Barriefield. It will be remembered, though dimly, that after a long drawn-out controversy, the city oiled the road to the camp. Now, however, there is not even a suggestion that oil was ever put on the road. Automobiles make ordinary driving, walking along the road very unpleasant to say the least. The cars driven by would-be chauffeurs race from the time they leave the bridge until they arrive at the camp, and there is constantly a cloud of dust all over the country. The speeders should be brought up before a J. P. as it is certainly a serious violation of the law to travel forty miles an hour from Cataragi bridge to Barriefield camp, and this is what some of the drivers boast of having done.

Lieut. Col. S. A. Thompson of the Royal Military College instructed staff was to give a lecture to the officers of the 80th Battalion on Wednesday morning but owing to pressure of work at the college it was postponed.

Major Alger gave a lecture on "Sanitation" to the N.C.O.'s of the 80th Battalion on Wednesday morning.

For an hour and a half on Wednesday afternoon the 90th Battalion was instructed in marching and saluting. This morning was taken up with instruction in trench-digging.

Major de Hertel brought thirty-three recruits from Smith's Falls for the 80th Battalion on Thursday. The Major and his squad of recruits will be a familiar feature on Thursdays at the camp until the 80th Battalion is up to strength.

Five men of the 32nd Battery, who it will be remembered were arrested at Ottawa for deserting, were brought before Major McKenzie who remanded them for trial by District Court Martial.

The artillerymen at Barriefield camp are now receiving all their uniforms.

The men of the 8th Regiment, C.M.R., who are members of the overseas draft, are receiving their uniforms from the quarter-master's stores.

The canteen of the 80th Battalion opened on Tuesday evening and is one of the best in the camp.

The non-commissioned officers' mess of the 34th Battery will be ready soon.

The 59th Battalion took a route-march down the Gananoque road returning by the Gore road on Thursday. Lieut. Col. H. J. Dawson is of the opinion that route-marches are excellent for training men.

The officers of the 59th Battalion are baseball enthusiasts. They played the Provisional School of Infantry officers on Wednesday evening. The score was not available owing to the modesty of the winners.

Lieut. Col. Clarke, (formerly Capt. Clarke of Kingston), A.D. of S. and T. Col. Biggar, is expected in the city to-day.

The rumor goes that the horses of the 8th C.M.R. will be divided up among the different units now requiring horses. These units are the three artillery batteries, the 80th Battalion, 77th Battalion and the Royal Military college.

Lieut. Elliott, attached to the 33rd Battery, who has been on sick leave, being in the General Hospital with symptoms of typhoid, has reported for duty.

Lieut. Young, gave a lecture to the men of the 32nd Battery on horse management on Wednesday afternoon, a horse from the 8th C.M.R. being used for the purpose.

The 32nd Battery was engaged yesterday in battery drill with dragoes in the absence of horses to pull the guns.

There is a rumour around Barriefield camp that the Minister of Militia would visit the camp this week.

Charles Sharpe, formerly boys' secretary for the Toronto West-end Y.M.C.A., is now in charge of the social work at Barriefield camp. He has enlisted for overseas service, in fact resigning from the Toronto institution for the purpose, and is an exceptionally valuable man.

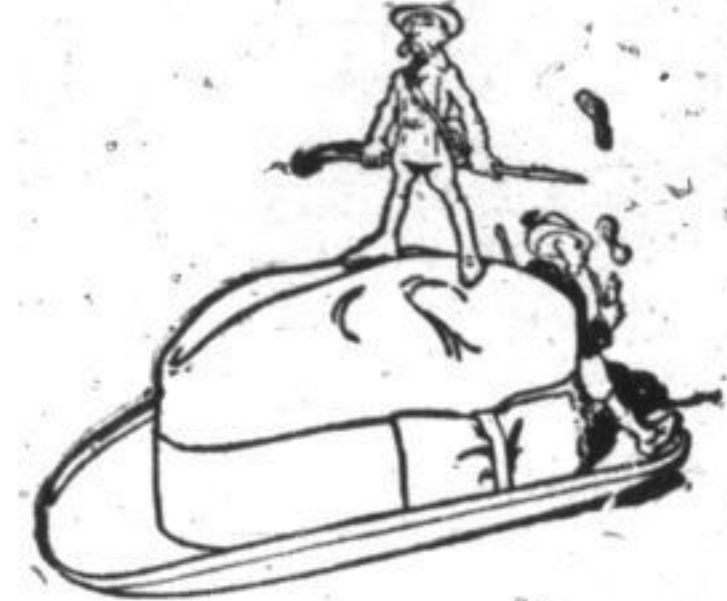
