A Disgraceful Game.

There are some indications in newspapers supporting the Ottawa Government that if an election is held this autumn the people are to be urged to support the Ministry on the score that Sir Wilfrid Laurier is "disloyal." In other words, the old "game" is to be tried once more. It would be a pretty spectacle, indeed, Hon. Pierre E. Blondin and Hon. Louis Coderre, with their Cabinet colleagues and supporters, adjuring the electors to scorn the "disloyal" Laurier. It was necessary for Canadians, said Mr. Blondin, on one occasion, to shoot holes in the British flag in order to breathe the air of liberty—but vote against the "disloyal" Laurier and keep Mr. Blondin, Mr. Coderre and their associates in power. The alliance between the Conservative leaders and the Nationalist leaders in 1911 and the utterances of Mr. Blondin, Mr. Coderre, Mr. Sevigny and their comrades are matters of record—but vote against the "disloyal" Laurier.

The Real Truth.

Ottawa Citizen. The truth, apparently hard for Germany longer to conceal, is that the Dardanelles are slipping from Turkey's fingers despite the help of Berlin and that when the wash occurs there will be an immediate scramble of the hitherto neutral Balkan nations to line up on the side of the Allies to participate in the spoils. This is the whole secret of the present activity in the Balkans and Germany knows the outcome better than any other European power in the conflict. The latest plan looks like a last desperate chance of the enemy to precipitate Bulgaria, Rumania and Greece into the war, thereby affording Turkey an opportunity to save her European Ally.
