WHAT BERLIN CLAIMS.
 Says That Germans Took 1,200 British Prisoners.
 (Special to the Whig.)
 London, Sept. 27.—The Berlin official statement to-day claims that the Germans took 1,200 British prisoners in the recent fighting, including an English brigade commander and several officers. The Germans also took ten machine guns at this point.
 In the fighting in eastern Champagne the French losses totalled more than 3,750, said Berlin.

 Italian military experts affirm that all preparations have been made to send, wherever necessary, a contingent of Italian troops sufficient to exercise considerable influence on developments.
 That Great Britain began this month to transport contingents of troops from her West Indian possessions to England or northern France became known on Sunday when the steamship Byron arrived from South America, and from her port of call at Bridgetown in the Barbadoes.
