SUED GIRL FOR RING

BECAUSE SHE DECIDED NOT TO MARRY HIM.

Judge Madden Decided in the Plaintiff's Favor—Leighton Guess Wins a Case Against An Automobile Owner.

"I want my ring back because I did not marry her," was the plea that greeted Judge Madden in the Division Court on Tuesday morning.

It was probably one of the most humorous cases that has been heard in Division Court in a long while.

The wedding ring, which was not only minus a wife, but also a wrist-watch and several handkerchiefs which he claimed he gave to his bride-to-be just before the ceremony was to have been performed.
