POPULATION OF KINGSTON INCREASED 64 IN YEAR

Notwithstanding That Over a Thousand Men Have Gone Overseas--The Assessment Increased \$374,795--Assessor's Report Issued on Friday.

Although more than a thousand men have gone from Kingston on overseas service, the population of this city, as shown by Assessor W. S. Gordon's annual report issued Friday morning, has increased by 64. The population this year is 21,225, as against 21,261 last year. The increased number of workmen in the Locomotive Works are not taken into account in this figure, so that the population would show probably 300 better if the counting was made now.

The assessment is \$12,762,769, an increase of \$304,795 over that of last year. Kingston is one of those places in Canada that has a big amount of exempted property. The assessor's returns show that the property exemptions here amount to no less than \$4,764,345, over one-third of the total assessment.

The report shows that Kingston has 6,005 children of school age; 778 dogs and 93 bitches.
