MAY BE ABROAD—STORY IS BEING INVESTIGATED

By United States Government—Kron Prinz Wilhelm Officers Engaged As Commerce Raiders. German Pirate Abroad. Washington, Oct. 25.—Evidence, seeming to corroborate information given New York Customs officials concerning the American steamship Zealandia, has been obtained by the Justice Department. Complete corroboration means—so Customs officials here said to-day—that there is a German pirate ship abroad on the seas, subject to capture by any other vessel able to effect, and with hanging awaiting all members of the crew.
