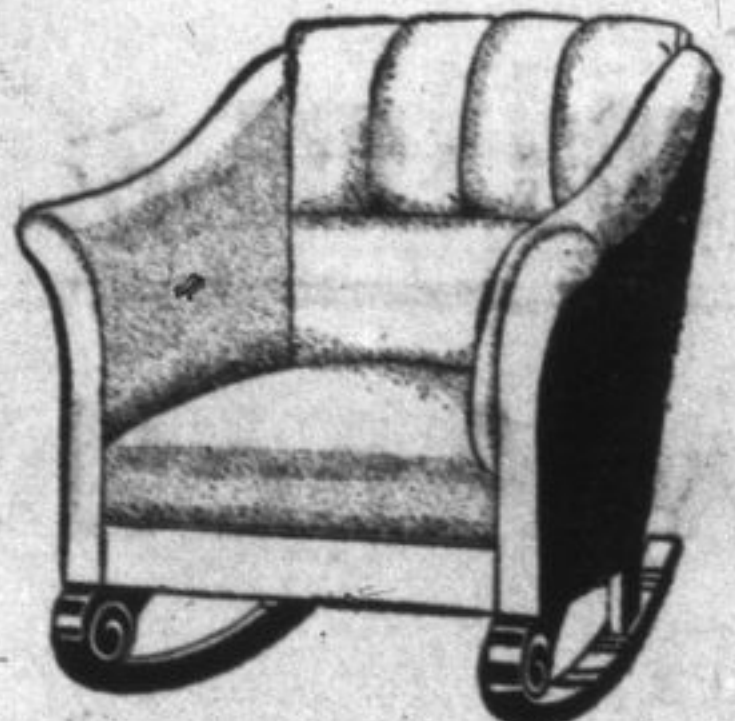

Acceptable Accommodation For Them—Mayor Sutherland Has Called a Special Meeting of the City Council.

Mayor Sutherland has called a special meeting of the City Council for Thursday evening to consider a proposal to supply accommodation for an additional 350 men to be recruited to the batteries wintering here. Kingston can get the 350 men if it gives good accommodation. The Mayor figures that it will cost perhaps \$5,000 to make necessary provision for them, and will ask Council if it is not worth while expending that amount to get \$100,000 in return.

Efforts are being made to have the 59th Battalion winter here, should that unit not be sent overseas this autumn. The wintering of the C. M. R. squadron now at Barrieffield Camp is also being sought by the city authorities. Provision can be made here for all these units. Kingston being a divisional and training centre, the troops would be whipped into shape much quicker and better than if divided into companies throughout the district.
