

W. B. Lanigan, of the C. P. R., is a great big traffic chief out West. Rides in his private car, and has any number of alert servetors on the Iron Road to whom he says: "do this," and they do it; and "don't do this," and they obey just as blithely and beautifully. Martin N. Todd, the other-man, has

kept the noiseless tenor of his way, without the newspaper or the magazine paying him much attention. Not that Mr. N. Todd, in his chosen field of railway work, has not achieved things scoring as high as the things scored for W. B.
