

OPENING OF DERBY'S PLAN.

Personal Canvass For Recruits Begins In London.

London, Oct. 30 .- The system of personally canvassing for recruits under the plan of the new director of recruits of the Earl of Derby, began in several districts of London yesterday. Soldiers and civilians with lists of names taken from the recent national register made a round of visits and brought back distinctly favorable reports, although the officials say that it is too early yet to announce whether the novel method of recruiting will prove successful.

MUSEUM OF ATROCITIES.

Many Photographs Of Soldiers Mutilated By Germans.

London, Oct. 30 .- A despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company from Petrograd says: "The German atrocities museum was opened here today. It contains a large number of photographs of mutilated soldiers whose wounds are alleged to have been caused by explosive bullets, and also tables of statistics of 5,000 cases of atrocities investigated by the special commission of enquiry into Ger-man atrocities, by which the museum was established."

Hog Quarantine Relaxed.

Ottawa, Oct. 30 .- The Department of Agriculture has relaxed the regulations regarding the transit through Canada of dressed hogs from the United States. This regulation was enforced under the Animal Contagious Diseases Act early in September following an outbreak in the United States. Carload shipments of dressed hogs from the United States for export by sea are to be allowed to pass through Can-ada in bond, providing the steps and running-boards are disinfected at the port of entry to the satisfaction of the Dominion Government inspectors and that the cars themselves are disinfected under the same supervision immediately until unloading

SEAT SELLS FOR \$73,000.

New York, Oct. 29 .- The stock exchange membership of the late Edward Wasserman was sold for \$73, 000, a gain of \$1,000 over the last preceding sale and a new high record for the year. This was the third time this seat figured in the stock exchange records since it was up for sale, the two preceding transactions being declared null and void

The company has limited its output accordingly. While the official statement of ore reserves and developments will not be made known for a month yet, when the annual meeting takes place, reserves have not been diminished. Up to Oct. 31st 1914, the company paid \$7,240,000 in dividends on a capital of \$4,000;
