MUSEUM OF ATROCITIES. Many Photographs Of Soldiers Mutilated By Germans.

London, Oct. 30.—A despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company from Petrograd says: "The German atrocities museum was opened here today. It contains a large number of photographs of mutilated soldiers whose wounds are alleged to have been caused by explosive bullets, and also tables of statistics of 5,000 cases of atrocities investigated by the special commission of enquiry into German atrocities, by which the museum was established."

AUSTRALIA'S ARMY PLANS

DENIES ORGANIZED PLOT.

Prince Reginald De Croy On Edith Cavell Case. London, Oct. 30.—Prince Reginald De Croy authorizes the Daily Sketch to deny the German allegations of the existence of any organization to assist soldiers to escape from Belgium, of which he and Miss Edith Cavell, as alleged, were the leaders. He says that so far from there being such an organization, some of the prisoners tried at Brussels did not even know the others. He himself did not counsel soldiers to escape, but when he found that they were determined to escape he assisted them, as did Miss Cavell, from humanitarian motives.

High Record For Year Established At New York. New York, Oct. 29.—The stock exchange membership of the late Edward Wasserman was sold for \$73,000, a gain of \$1,000 over the last preceding sale and a new high record for the year.

Conigas Dividend Passed. Toronto, Oct. 29.—The directors of Conigas Mines have decided not to pay the dividend that is usually paid on Nov. 1st.

New Steel Head's Salary. New York, Oct. 29.—Wall Street estimates name the probable salary of A. C. Dinkey as president of the Midvale Steel as \$75,000 to \$100,000.

Commercial News. The Canadian Ford Co. has declared a 50 per cent. cash dividend. It is reported that the Vipond will go on a 16 per cent. basis before the end of the year.

The Bureau of Railway Economics says railroad taxes in the last ten year have increased 136 per cent. Price paid for the Remington Arms Co., which will go into the new Midvale Steel and Ordnance Co. is understood to have been \$20,000,000.

Contracts have been let by the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad for 62,500 tons of 100-pound rails for immediate delivery.

The Canadian Car & Foundry Company has disposed of 2,500 each common and preferred shares to the Royal Securities Corporation.

War orders placed with Canadian Car & Foundry Co. by the Russian Government amount to \$12,000,000. This total includes only business actually signed for.

Value of meats exported from the United States for the first eight months in 1915, \$172,159,626, compared with \$80,833,350 for the corresponding period of 1914.

A new \$10,000,000 power company for Montreal has been incorporated this week entitled the Laurentide Power Company, Ltd. It will carry on a light, heat and power business.

Serious Seed Situation. Toronto, Oct. 29.—The situation in regard to seed does not improve as the weeks go by.

Not much relief to the situation is afforded even by the case of alfalfa. There has been a failure in Alberta, which has begun to be quite an important source of supply, and Keith's report that there is practically none in Ontario.
