OBITUARY

The Late H. H. Scott.

Many Kingstonsians will hear with regret of the death of Howard Hamilton Scott, son of Rev. A. H. Scott, the well-known author-minister of Perth. Howard Scott graduated from Queen's University in 1905, and soon had a splendid position with the Allis-Chalmers Company in Montreal. He had been ill for some time at Saranac Lake. His father only recently heard that another of his sons had been wounded at the front and taken prisoner.
