TO TRY NEWSPAPER MAN

FRENCH LOAN FROM JAPAN.

London, Nov. 8.—The London Times says: "We hear that arrangements are in progress in Paris for the issuing of a loan to France from Japan, probably in five per cent bonds. If this is correct, it has been one of the most interesting new departures seen in international finance as a result of the war."

POSSESSES EVIDENCE.

New York, Nov. 8.—The Government has in its possession evidence showing that more than \$500,000 has been spent by the operators of what is believed to be a country-wide scheme to prevent munitions reaching the Allies.
