MUTINY ON LAKE BOAT. Captain Holds Back Crew Armed With Revolvers. Buffalo, N. Y., Nov. 10.—Mutiny on a Great Lakes freighter, the first incident of the kind recorded here in many years, is alleged to have occurred Monday night on the steamer J. K. D'Arcy, of Detroit.

Robert Hamill, a whoopman in is in hospital in a critical condition from a beating he received and two members of the crew, Albert Suenek and Frank Benz, are under arrest, and will be given a hearing before a Federal commissioner to-morrow.

The steamer J. K. D'Arcy had just been cast off the dock when the trouble began. Captain William Jagnau told the police. He feared an outbreak and had sent Wheelman Hamill aft to see that all was well.

Hamill was seized, it is alleged, and beaten into insensibility, and several members of the crew, armed with revolvers, rushed upon Captain Jagnau. The captain retreated to the men back with an iron bar, and shouted word to a dock watchman, who notified the police. When the police boat arrived, Captain Jagnau picked out Suenek and Benz as the leaders, and they were arrested.
