BELGIAN WOMAN'S BABY KILLED BEFORE HER EYES

Pte. J. Naillie, Visiting At Joyceville, Tells Story MOTHER TOLD TO HIM

OF THE AWFUL BRUTALITY OF THE GERMANS.

The Woman Came Out to Canada—Pte. Naillie Suffers From Rheumatism—Served With Cameron Highlanders.

That her baby was cut into pieces before her own eyes by German soldiers, is the awful story that a Belgian woman told to Pte. J. Naillie, a member of the 16th Battalion, First Canadian Contingent, who has been sent home as a result of his suffering from rheumatism.

The woman said that German soldiers took possession of her home, but were eventually driven from the house by British soldiers.

The woman also told about another case of extreme brutality on the part of the Germans, when they bayoneted a boy, and carried him around on the point of a bayonet.

Pte. Naillie was a member of the 43rd Battalion, at Winnipeg, and served with the Cameron Highlanders.

THRILLING PRODUCTION

OF "THE BIRTH OF A NATION" AT THE GRAND.
