ARE KEEPING FIT.
Canadians' Spirits Unbroken After Months in Trenches.

London, Nov. 22.—Major-General A. W. Currie, commanding the first division, is in London on ten days' leave. He states that within a short time all the men in the front will have had their turn at least. He strongly favors leave being granted, as it freshens the men and renders them more fit for renewed warfare.

Leave for eight or ten days every third month is being arranged as far as possible. Major-General Currie spoke highly of the spirit and discipline of his division being unbroken after several months in the field.

The trenches, said Major-General Currie, were getting into bad condition again, owing to the lack of material, though much good constructive work has been done to mitigate the former flooding. Asked what the men would appreciate most as Christmas gifts, he suggested puddings, cakes, chocolates, beef extracts for hot drinks, and tobacco and cigarettes.

A New Customs Tax.
Ottawa, Nov. 22.—All Canadian imports into New Zealand will shortly have to pay an increased customs tax, known as a primage duty, of one per cent, according to a report to the Trade and Commerce Department by Commissioner Beddoe, of Auckland, N.Z. This primage duty, which applies to all imports, has been substituted for a tax on gasoline, which proved unpopular.

The War Factory Fires Were All De-liberate.
Philadelphia, Nov. 22.—"Every one of the fires in plants making munitions and other supplies for the Allies were of incendiary nature, started by persons as yet undiscovered," was the statement of Joseph L. Baldwin, State fire marshal, when seen in this city to-day. Baldwin said a microscopic examination made at Eddystone, and at Trenton, had convinced him the blazes were deliberately started by human agency.
"In the Baldwin plant at Eddystone," continued Mr. Baldwin, "the fire originated at a time when the creek was very low, thereby lessening fire protection, and when the wind was high, giving the fire an excellent chance to sweep the entire plant."
