VICTORY BY GERMANY. Would Be Tragic, Says a Teuton Editor.

Philadelphia, Nov. 22.—J. Koettgen, a solid looking German, for twenty years editor and London correspondent of The Berlin Vorwaerts, speaking at the Broad Street Theatre this afternoon, shook his finger at the audience that filled the house, and shouted: "Democracy will suffer if Germany wins the war."

Mr. Koettgen did not confine his criticism to Germany. He phrased his lecture from the standpoint of an internationalist, and showed no national prejudice. He said that if any combination of nations won the war a terrible militarism would result.

CANADIAN OFFICER IN GERMANY Report on Camp Received Through The American Ambassador.

Ottawa, Nov. 22.—A list of prisoners at Clauthal, Germany, has been forwarded from Germany by the American Ambassador. The list contains the names of 174 officers, British, French, Belgian and Russian.

There is only one Canadian, Major Douglas McQuig, of the 13th battalion, First Canadian Division. This is the Montreal officer who was first reported killed in the famous engagement of last April, but who was later reported as a prisoner of war in Germany.

Clauthal is situated in the Harz Mountains, and an American official who visited the wooden hotel now used as a military prison, describes the officers as comfortably situated and enjoying a number of privileges. The camp is somewhat overcrowded, but the German officials have promised to relieve the congestion by removing the Russian officers to another location.

HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED. Proof That German U-Boat Sank Italian Vessel.

Rome, Nov. 22.—The idea Nazionale says that the German submarine which torpedoed the British armed boarding steamer Tara in the Eastern Mediterranean on November 5th, and two Anglo-Egyptian gunboats in the Gulf of Sullum on November 6th, also torpedoed the Italian liners Ancona, Firenze and Boenja.

The newspaper adds: "The characteristics of the submarine, its displacement, armament, and course, were already sufficient proof of its identification. Now Germany's confession brings additional confirmation. Hence, further hesitation on the part of the Italian Government is impossible."

WAS BADLY HURT. Had Three Ribs And His Collar Bone Broken.

William Hartman, Tichborne, met with a very painful accident last Wednesday while attending the threshing machine at his home. It appears that the blower pipe on the machine became clogged with straw, and Mr. Hartman climbed up to the peak of the barn to get at it.

Unfortunately the scaffold broke and Mr. Hartman fell a distance of fifteen feet, lighting on his chest across a beam, breaking three ribs and his collar bone. He is in a critical condition at present.

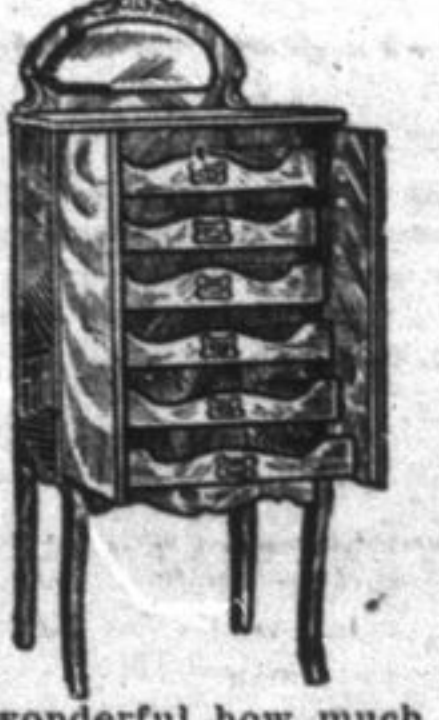
