REFERENDUM

TO PEOPLE ON STREET RAIL-WAY POWER QUESTION.

Utilities Commission Will Renew Old Rate If Ratepayers Say So-Street Railway President's Let-

After a conference with the members of the Utilities Commission on Chursday night, the civic Finance Committee decided to submit to the ratepayers at the January elections a referendum asking them if they are in favor of the Commission renewng the old power agreement with the Street Railway Company at 1,20

The power question was thoroughy discussed by the Council commitee and the Commission, and it was agreed that this was the best that could be done. That the people will vote in favor of the old power rate being renewed, there is no doubt

The Utilities Commission at its meeting Monday afternoon asked the Street Railway Company to say if it would accept the proposition of submitting the power question to the people. This is the answer received from H. W. Richardson, president of the company, by General Manager Folger:

"Dear Sir:-Yours of Nov. 29th suggesting a contract between the Company and the City for a continued supply of power at the former rate of 1.20 cents per k.w., subject to the approval of the ratepayers,

fuly received and noted "The financial condition of the Company, disclosed by the report of the auditor representing your comssion, has made manifest the fu tility of the Company further attempting to profitably conduct oper ation unless some scheme for increasing earnings or lessening expense is devised
