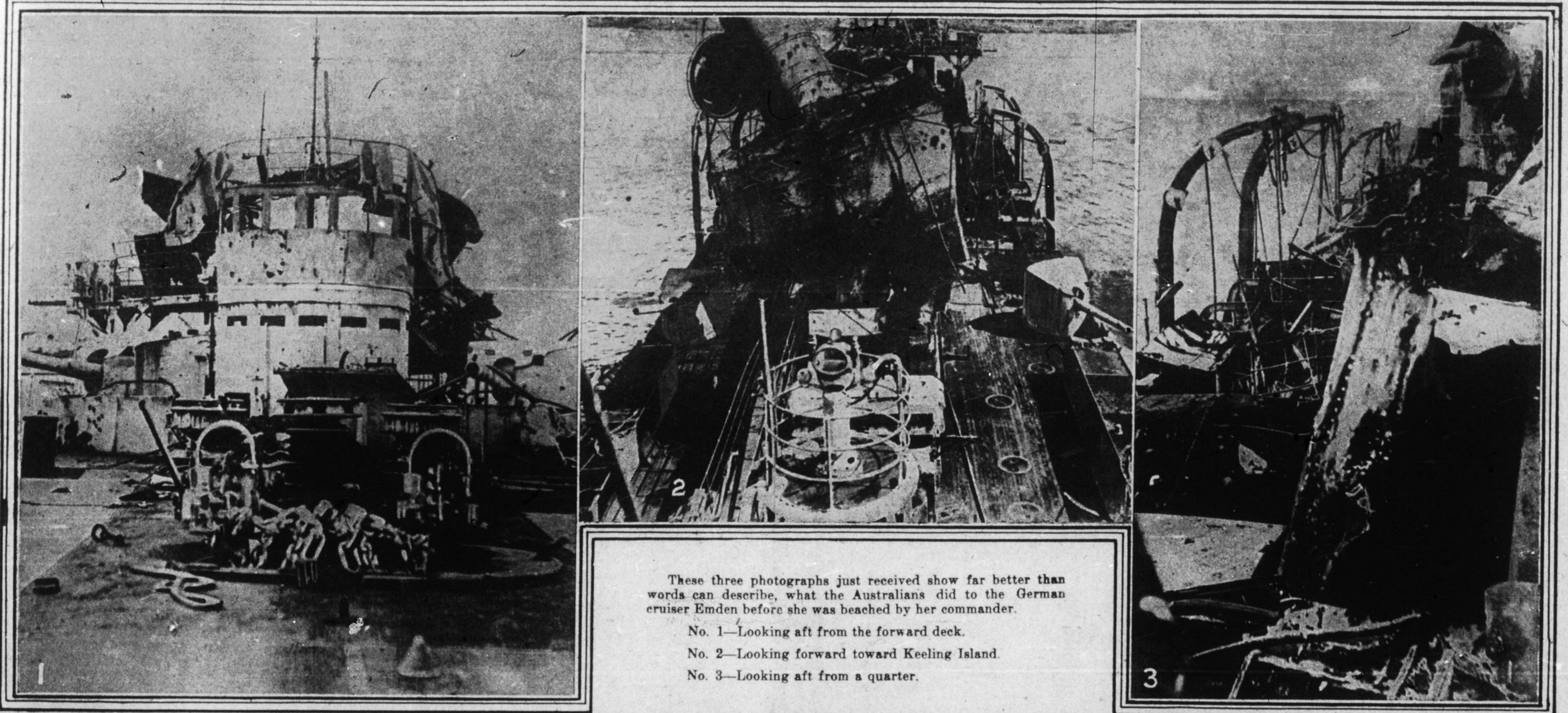

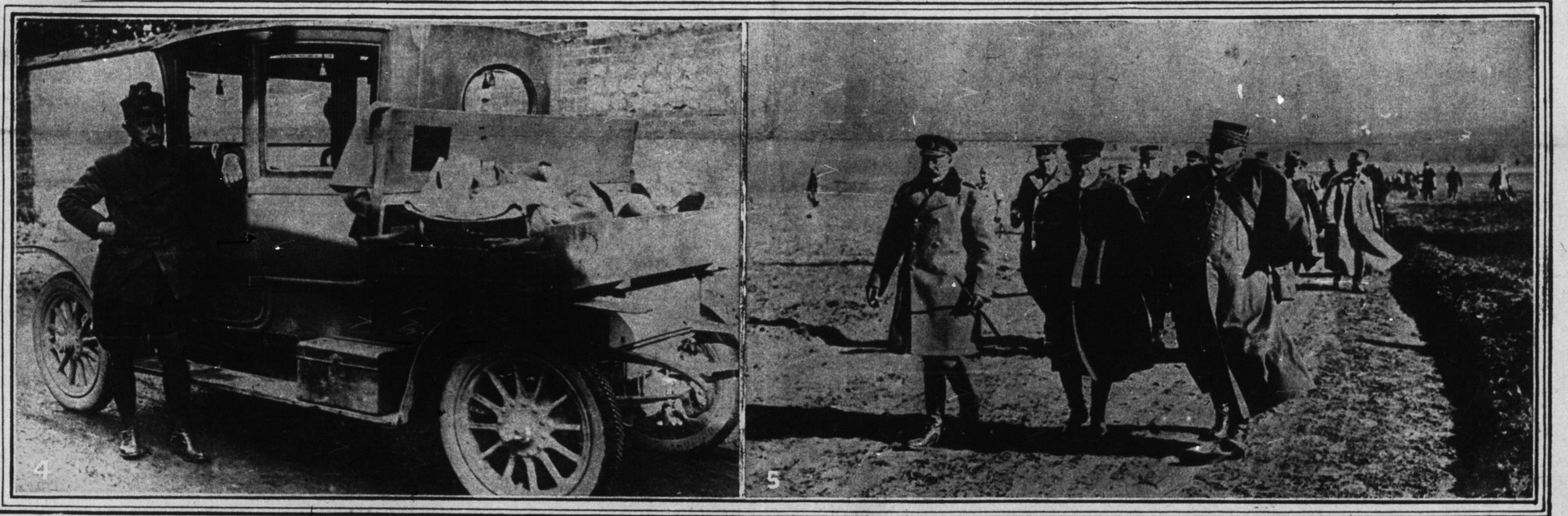


These three photographs just received show far better than words can describe, what the Australians did to the German cruiser Emden before she was beached by her commander.

No. 1—Looking aft from the forward deck.

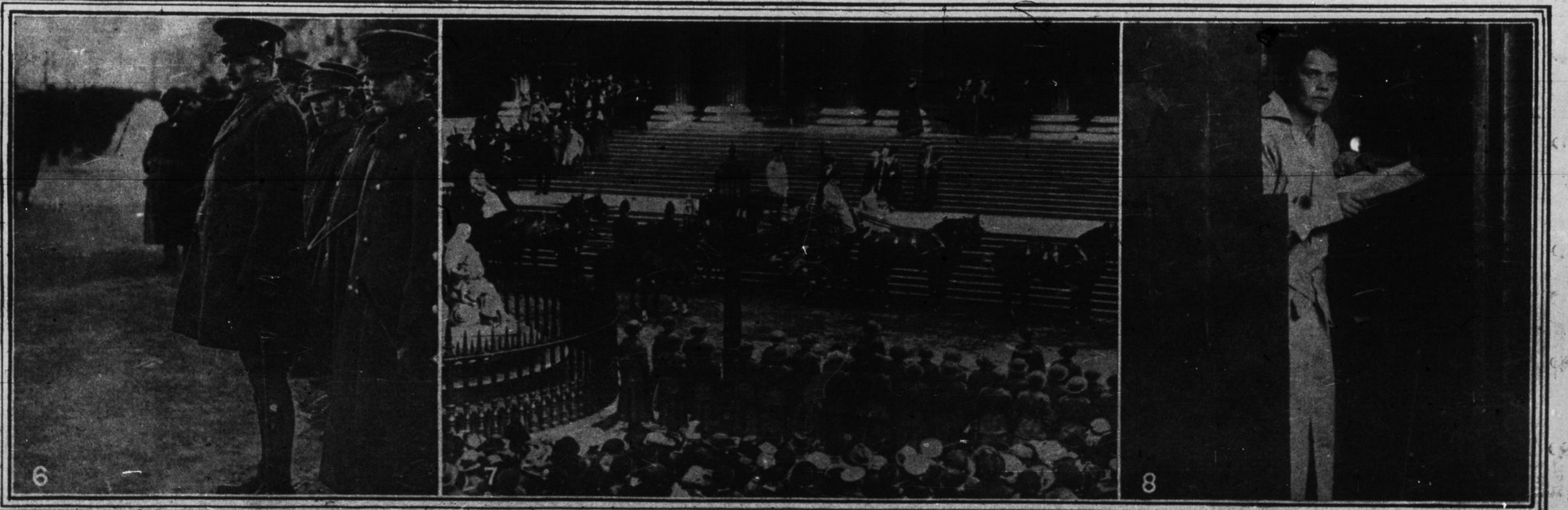
No. 2—Looking forward toward Keeling Island.
