A CALL IS EXTENDED

TO REV. E. R. McLEAN, TORONTO, BY COOKE'S CHURCH

To Take the Place of Rev. J. W. McIntosh, Who Took a Charge at Prince Albert, Sask.—Was Unanimous Choice.

By a unanimous vote, the members of Cooke's Church, at a meeting held on Monday evening, extended a call to Rev. E. R. McLean, M.A., assistant pastor of Bonar Presbyterian Church, Toronto, to succeed Rev. J. W. McIntosh, who recently accepted a call to a charge at Prince Albert, Sask. It is understood that Mr. McLean will accept.

The meeting was very largely attended, and as already stated the choice was a unanimous one. Only one name was proposed, and 180 members signed the call for the new pastor.

It was announced that the call would come before the meeting of the Kingston Presbytery on Tuesday. Mr. McLean is assistant to Rev. Dr. Alexander Macgillivray, brother of the Presbyterian General Assembly Moderator.

IN INTERESTS OF MINING.

C. H. Hall Making Social Study in Northern Part of County.

C. H. Hall is the author of a famous poem which he wrote on the war about a year ago, and which he has kindly given to the Whig, for publication in the Philadelphia Ledger, and caused much comment. Mr. Hall is an American citizen and the poem was written to offset the German feeling which was so prevalent across the border at the time.

Mr. Hall has been studying the mineral deposits lying north of Kingston in the lake country, and returned to this city last Saturday, the show in the northern districts having made field work impossible.

Mr. Hall has associated with nine prominent mine owners and operators of the Toplin Mo. Zinc district, and he has been studying the various mineral deposits of our north country for the past year.

Mr. Hall is recognized as an expert and comes to this section properly endorsed.

INVERARY YOUNG FARMER

Has Enlisted in the 146th Battalion For Overseas Service.

Elmer Shepherd, 47th Frontenac Regiment, one of Inverary's most prominent young farmers, has volunteered for overseas service with the 146th Battalion. He was in the Composite Regiment with Lieut.-Col. Ferguson, at the Tercentenary at Quebec in 1908, and did good service. Ever since he has maintained that military spirit, and any undertaking he enters, is with enthusiasm and is bound to be a success. He will be a great aid in recruiting for the County of Frontenac, and is the type of young man, that the county should feel justly proud of. He is now attending the school of instruction in Kingston. He is the only son of James Shepherd, Inverary, who has been a member of the Storrington Municipal Council for a number of years.

WAR BULLETINS.

The Anglo-French forces have all crossed into Greek territory, and are now under the protection of the Allies' warships guns.

British Bagdad forces repulse all Turkish attacks, inflicting very heavy losses on the enemy.

Russian artillery destroyed a Zeppelin on the Libau-Romin railway.

More than 100,000 machine guns have been completed to strengthen the German eastern front.

The last ten lists of Prussian casualties contain 65,340 names. The total Prussian losses to date are 2,224,248.

Final figures regarding the vote on church union in the Montreal Presbytery are: For union, 6,125; against, 4,975; majority for union, 1,150.

The estate of Colonel Farquhar, commandant of the Princess Pats, who was killed last March, has been probated at £14,000.
