A QUEEN'S DEPUTATION

INTERVIEWS ONTARIO GOVERNMENT REGARDING AID.

Bill To Come Before Legislature — Queen's Has No Intention Of Becoming a State University.

A Toronto despatch says: "The question of whether or not Queen's University may expect to receive direct Government aid as a university was taken to the Government on Thursday by a deputation representing the Board of Trustees, and introduced by W. F. Nickle, M.P., Kingston. The problem arises out of the bill which is to come before Parliament amending the School of Science with the University. The original reason for the distinction maintained between the two was that while Queen's was a university it could not receive Government aid. The School of Science did, however, receive such aid. The Board of Trustees now wants to know if the annual grants may be continued, and paid direct into the general coffers of the University. The Faculty of Medicine has also received a yearly grant, as a faculty in the proposed re-organization it is desired that this also be paid to the general funds. The two grants have approximated \$70,000 a year. It was pointed out that there is no desire or intention of making Queen's a State University, either in support or control, but merely that the Government grants to science and medicine be paid into the general coffers of the University, in re-organization of the type desired. The deputation was composed of Dr. D. M. Gordon, Principal of Queen's; G. Y. Chown, Treasurer; Hamilton Cassels, K.C., and Sir John Willison, Toronto.

DIED AT MADISON, WIS.
Widow Of Late Edwin ("Chaucer") Elliott Passed Away.
The sad news was received in the city of the death at Madison, Wis., on Thursday night, of Mrs. Elizabeth Montague, widow of the late Edwin S. ("Chaucer") Elliott, of this city. Deceased had been ailing for about eight months, and during that time had undergone two operations. She was well-known in Kingston, and her many friends were deeply grieved to learn of her death. Her husband died over three years ago. Deceased passed away at the home of her parents. Besides her parents and a number of brothers and sisters, she leaves a young son, Robert Fawcett. The remains will be interred at Madison, R. F. Elliott left on Thursday night to attend the funeral.

TO CONTINUE TO SEND.
Parcels To the Kingston War Prisoners In Germany.
The citizens appreciate the action of F. S. S. Johnson, American Consul, in forwarding Christmas gifts to the prisoners-of-war in Germany. Parcels are arriving every day. In an interview with the Whig some time ago the Consul stated that he would continue to forward all parcels that were received. Tobacco, pipes, cigarettes and other articles are being sent to him to be forwarded. He expects that by January 15th he will have about 100 parcels to send over if citizens continue to send in supplies. Until the names of the prisoners in Germany are received all parcels are being sent in care of the American Ambassador at Berlin.

City Hockey League.
A meeting of the City Hockey League was held on Thursday evening. Capt. Gill, 32nd Battery, was elected president and Leo Gallagher secretary. It was decided that the O.H.A. rules be adopted. It is likely there will be six teams in the league—Iroquois, Maple Leafs, C.L.C., 960 and two from the batteries.
