LAST OF HERD OF FIFTY IMPORTED SOME YEARS AGO.

And to Do Duty by Society People Should Have that Many, Says Professor.

Pittsburg, Dec. 22.—"One who has not three and seven-tenths children is a failure as a eugenic member of society, inasmuch as the best children are the fourth or fifth," said Prof. R. M. Johnson of the University of Pittsburg, addressing the eugenic section of the Academy of Science and Art.

KINGSTON EXPORTS ARE \$9,000 A DAY. Since October 1st, Owing to the War Orders Being Filled. The exports from the port of Kingston total over \$9,000 a day and have stood at this amount for the last two months and a half. In October, November and December of last year, the total of exports amounted to \$187,000, but since October 1st of this year the exports amount to \$755,000. F. S. & Johnson, American Consul says the cause of this enormous total is the heavy export of leather, knitted underwear and clothing that is being made in Canada to fill American war-orders.
