COUNCIL OF KINGSTON
CONSISTS OF TWENTY-TWO MEMBERS SINCE 1867.

The People Are Asked To Vote on Reducing Number of Aldermen From 21 to 14.

As the ratepayers are to vote on the questions of reducing the number of aldermen for a ward from three to two and the aldermanic term from three years to one year, at the municipal elections on January 3rd, it might interest the voters to know that when Kingston was incorporated as a town in the year 1838 it had a Council of nine, consisting of a mayor and one alderman and one councillor for each ward, of which there were four. The Council remained at nine members until Kingston was incorporated as a city in 1846. Then it was thought that nine men were not enough to govern such a large municipality; the wards were increased to five with two aldermen and two councillors for each. This made a City Council of twenty-one.

In the year 1850, the wards were increased to seven, Rideau and Victoria being added, and to this day the city is divided into the same wards as it was sixty-five years ago.

The year 1850 also saw a change in the ward representation, there being an alderman and two councillors for each ward. With the mayor, this made a council of twenty-two, the same as now.

In 1852, the Council was increased to twenty-nine, an additional alderman being elected for each ward.

The year 1866 saw the last of councillors in Kingston's governing body, the year of Confederation (1867) electing three aldermen for each ward. For the past forty-eight years, the Kingston Council has remained as it is now, consisting of a mayor and twenty-one aldermen.

The by-law upon which the people are to vote proposes a council of fourteen aldermen and a mayor.
