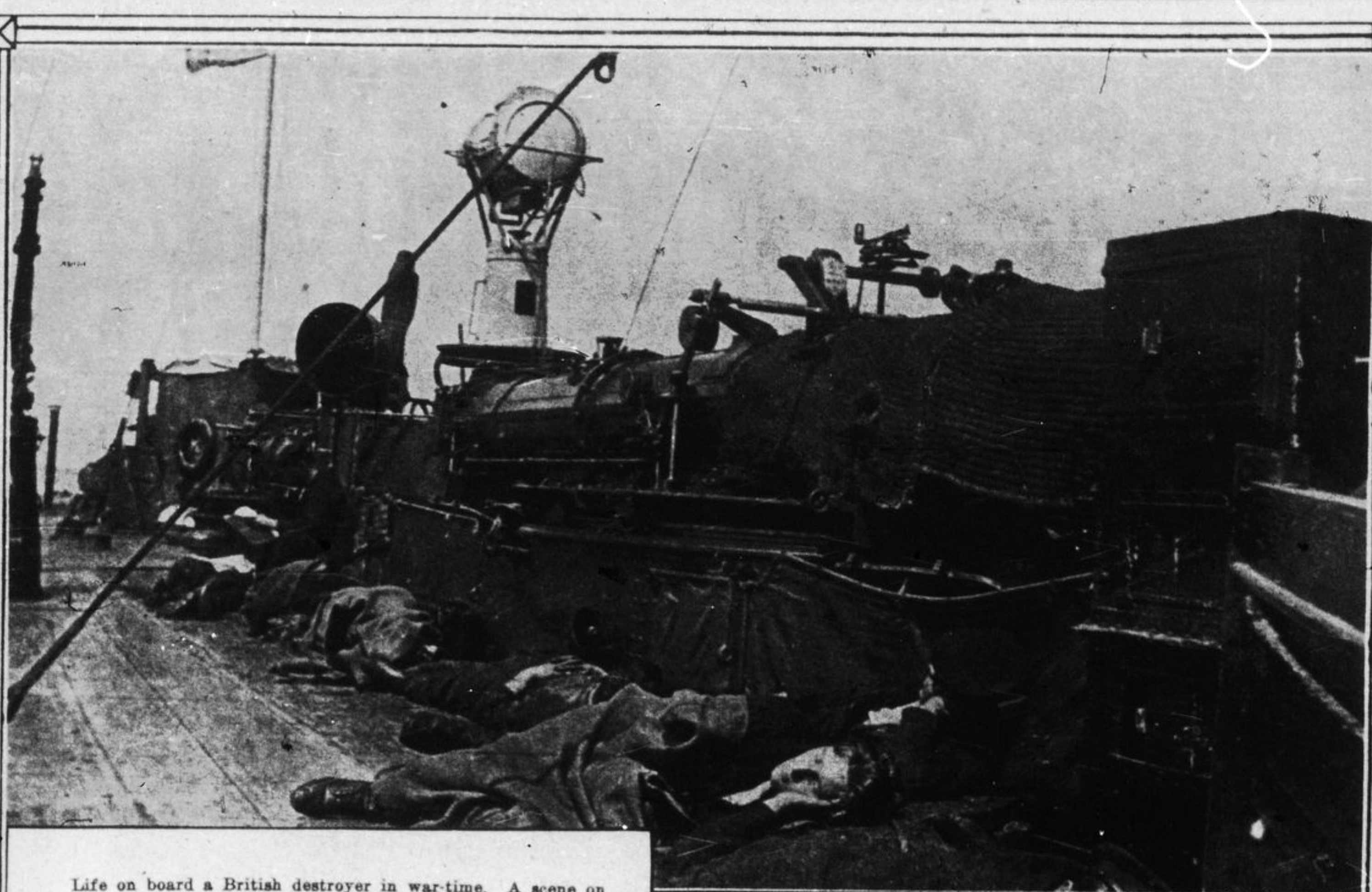
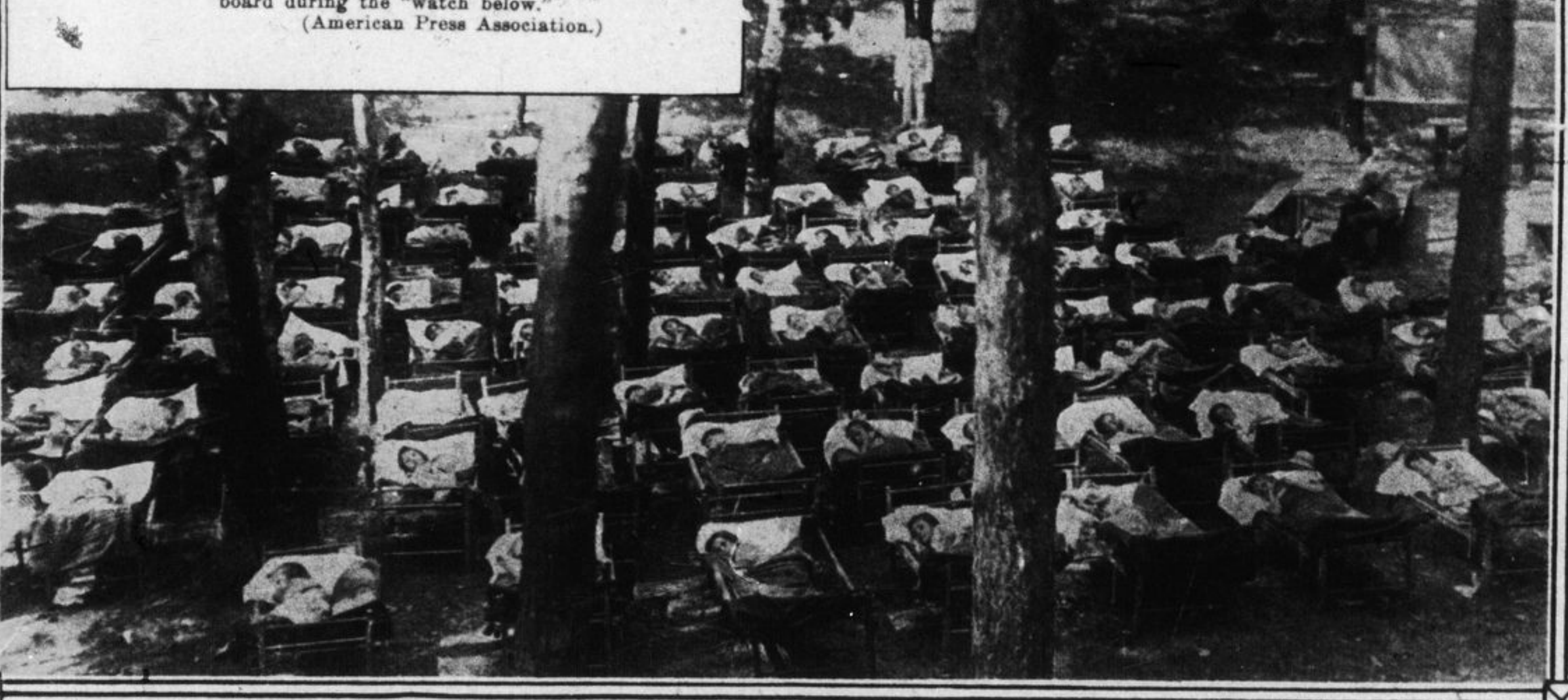


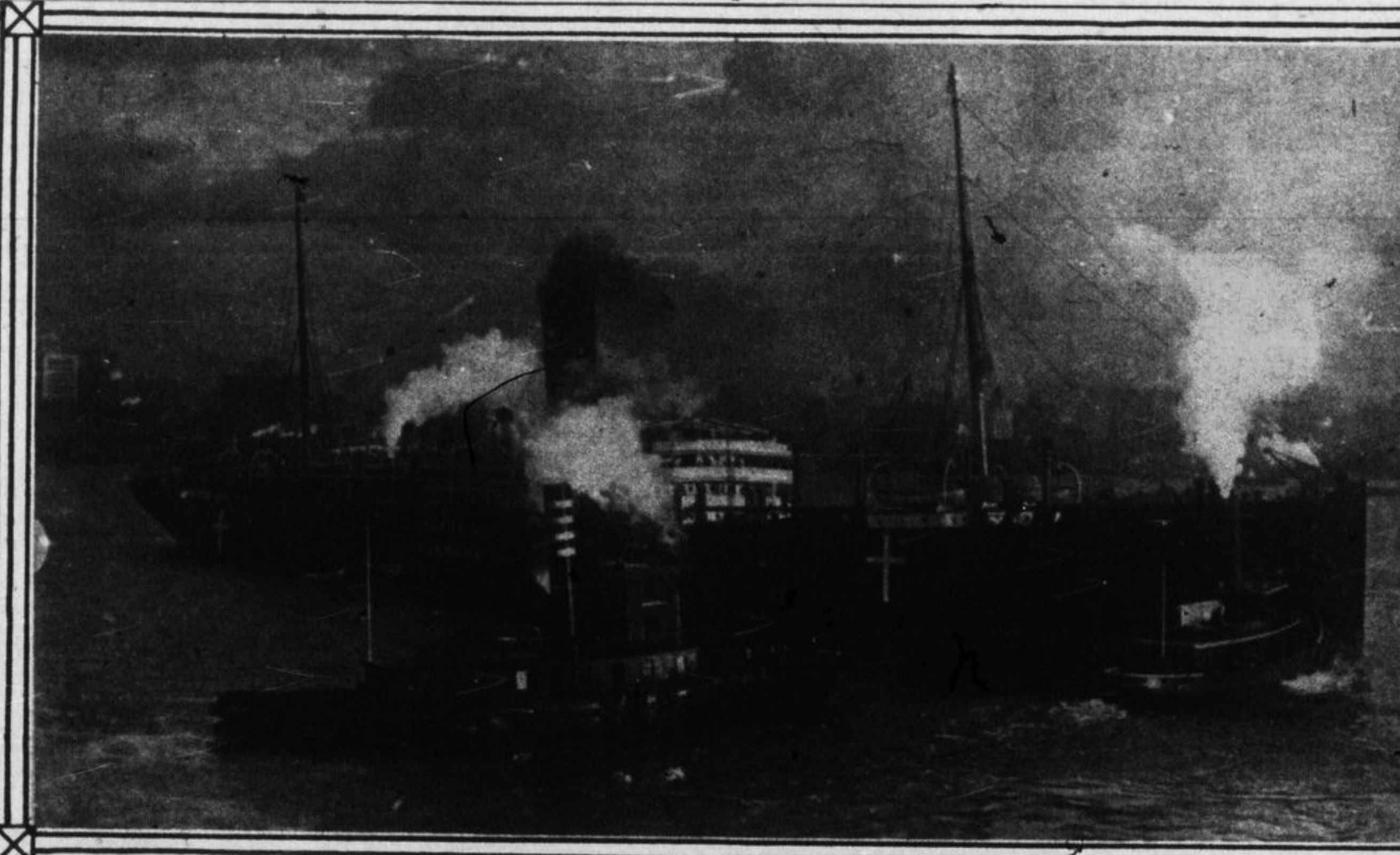
Sir Charles Wakefield, the new Lord Mayor of London. This photograph was just received, and shows Sir Wakefield in his official robes.



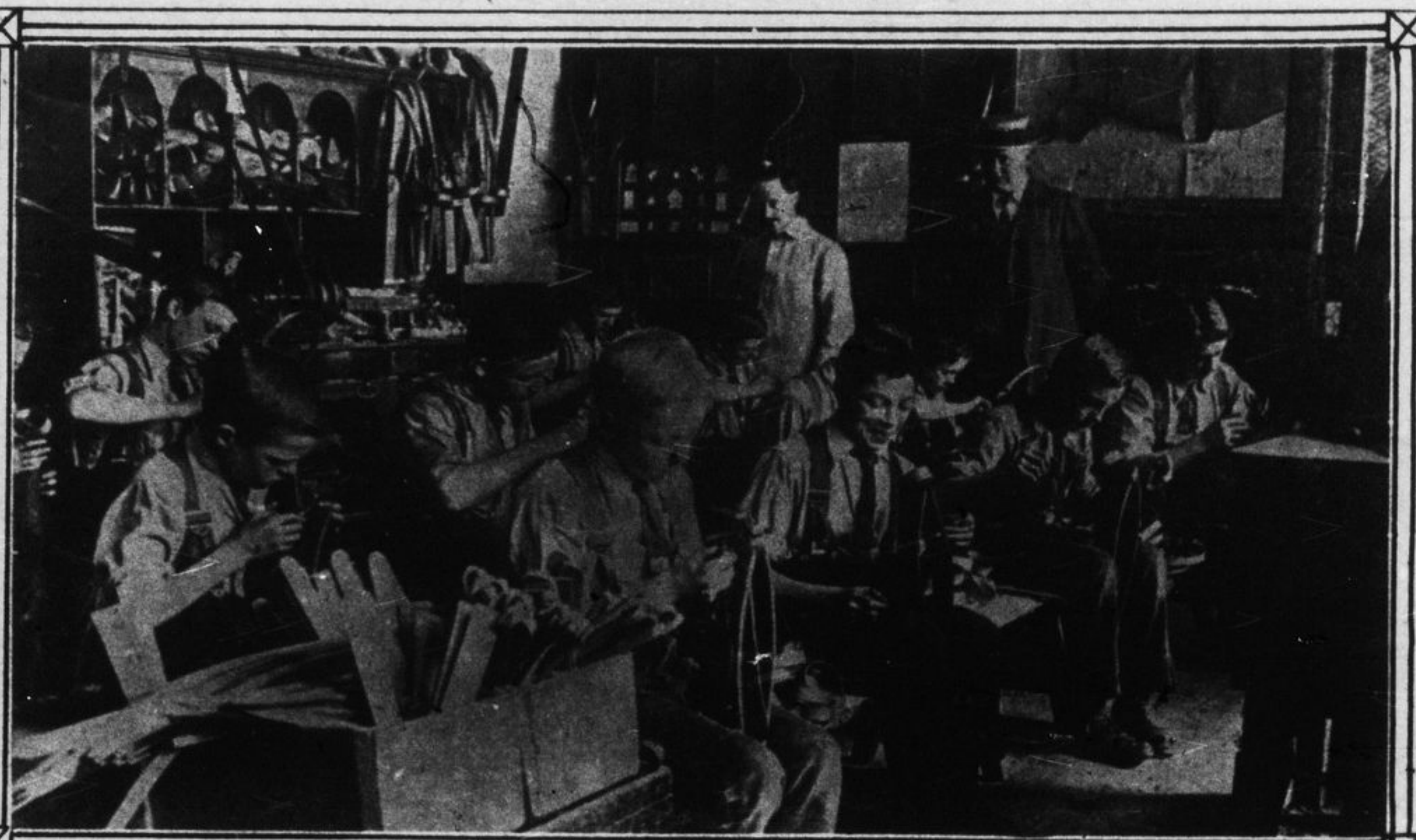
Life on board a British destroyer in war-time. A scene on board during the "watch below." (American Press Association.)



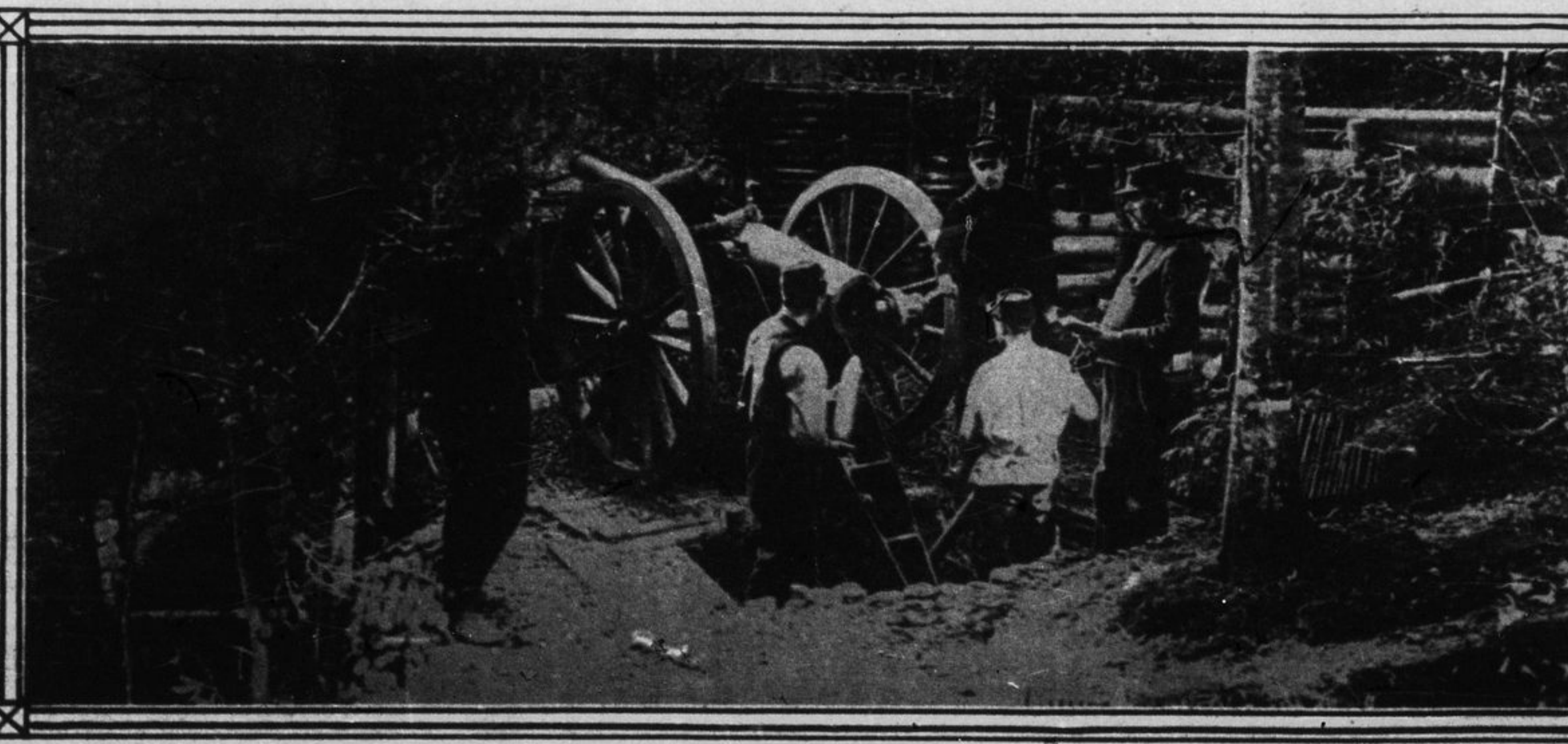

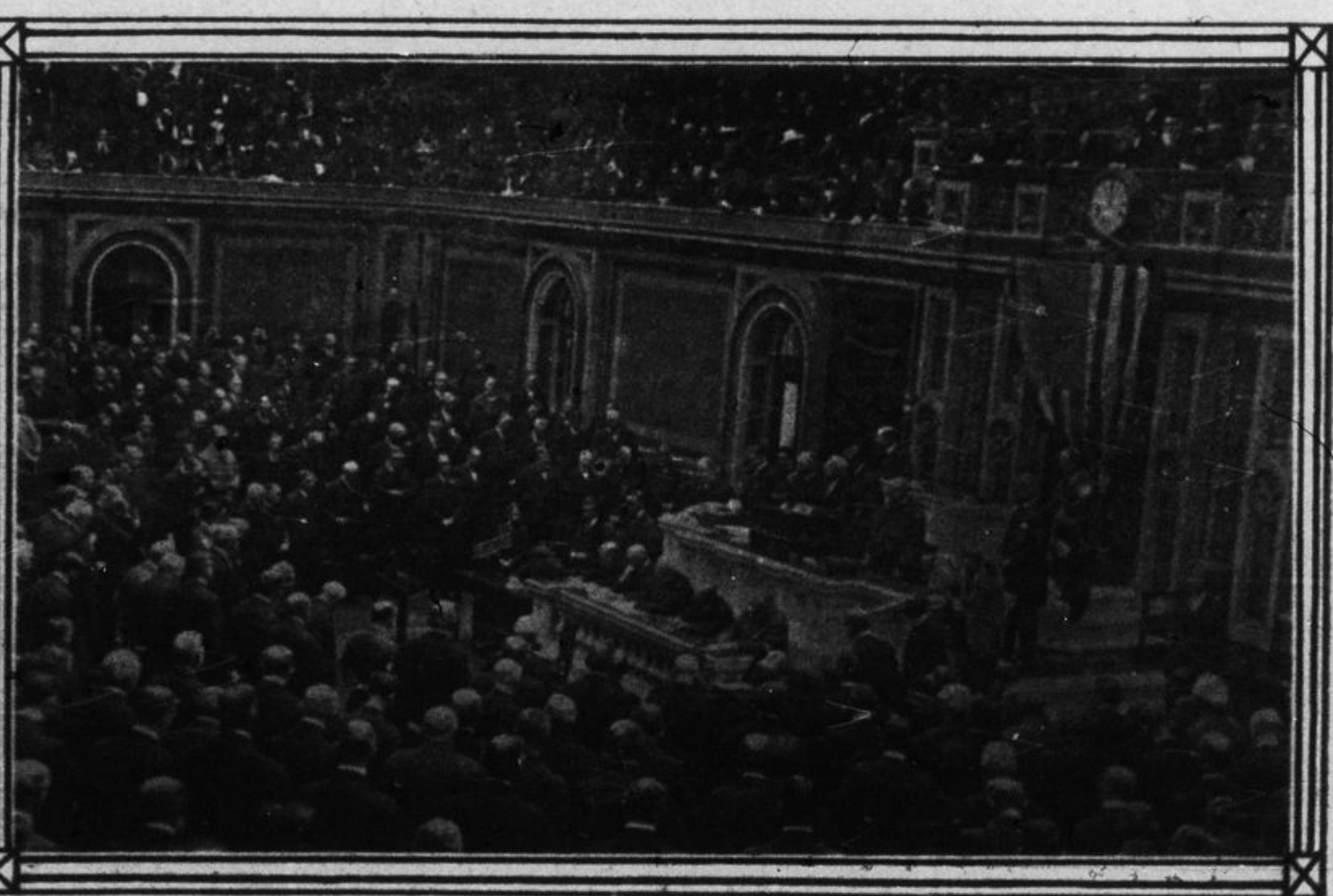
