**THE TURKISH FORCES SEVERELY DEFEATED.**  
Their Losses Were Quite Heavy—British Lost Less Than 200.

(Special to the Whig.) London, Dec. 27.—Turkish forces were defeated with heavy losses and driven back in an attack on the British Mesopotamian base of Kut El Amara Saturday, according to official despatches received here today.

Gen. Townshend reported the Turkish losses totalled between six and eight hundred. The British lost less than two hundred, he said.

**RUSSIANS DEFEAT PERSIAN GENDARMES.**  
Led By German Officers—German Batteries Silenced on Riga Front.

(Special to the Whig.) Petrograd, Dec. 27.—Several thousand rebellious Persian gendarmes, led by Turkish and German officers, were defeated by Russian troops midway between Teheran and Hamadan; it was officially announced today. The Persians were well armed with field artillery and machine guns.

"On the Riga front we silenced the German batteries," said the War Office, "south of Ikskul. The Germans used gas in an attack. On the Dvinsk front the enemy attempted an offensive, but was driven back."
