CAPTURED GERMANS POORLY TRAINED

French Officers in Alsace So Report—Many German Officers Captured.

(Special to the Whig.)

Paris, Dec. 28.—An unusually large percentage of German officers have been captured by the French in the severe fighting on Hartmanns Weilerkopf. There were many jaggers, irregular mountaineers, among the prisoners.

The French officers asserted that on the whole the Germans recently captured in Alsace have been poorly trained, indicating that Germany is now using many men previously deemed unfit.

Representatives of fifteen societies in Montreal, including the Chamber of Commerce, Board of Trade, Canadian manufacturers, and Trades and Labor Council, urged Premier Bourke to save the city from the class of the City Hall.
