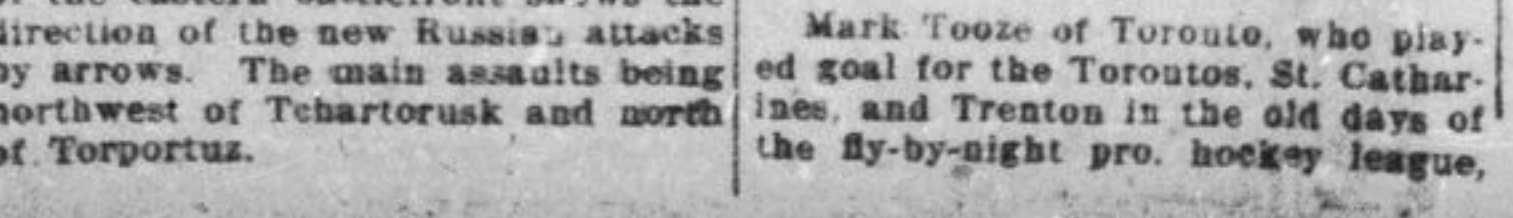


KITCHENER AND GREY IN PARIS. Photo shows British Ministers of War and Foreign Affairs, on their way to attend a War Council in Paris.
