PROTESTS TO BRITAIN.

Sweden Also Retaliates For Seizure and Detention Of Mails. London, Jan. 4.—The Swedish Government has sent a very sharp note to the British Government protesting against the holding up of mails from America to Sweden and the examination of the contents of parcels.

It is pointed out here that the British government, in examining postal correspondence going to Sweden or seizing parcels sent by parcel post to Sweden, some of whom are well known German agents, is within its rights, according to international law.

Local option carried in Carleton Place by 465 to 289; in Uxbridge by 264 to 153 and on Amherst Island by 150 to 49.

The by-law was sustained by Owen Sound by 404.
