PROTESTS TO BRITAIN.

Sweden Also Retaliates For Seizure and Detention Of Mails.

London, Jan. 4.—The Swedish Government has sent a very sharp note to the British Government protesting against the holding up of mails from America to Sweden and the examination of the contents of parcels. Sweden also has retaliated by stopping British mails going through that country to Russia and by holding up communications from Russia. But there has now been an improvement in this direction.

It is pointed out here that the British Government, in examining postal correspondence going to Sweden or seizing parcels sent by parcel post to Sweden, some of whom are well known German agents, is within its rights, according to international law. 

> WERE FOUND STARVING NEAR YUCATAN COAST.

Living on Island in Lighthouse Without Supplies For Four Months.

New York, Jan. 4.-Two men two women and three children, al starving, who had been without food. other than a few small fish for fifteen days, and the body of a woman, a victim of hunger, were found at Triangle lighthouse, near the Yucatan coast, in the Gulf of Mexico on December 23rd officers of the steamship Mexico, which arrived where to-day from Mexican ports. The occupants of the lighthouse, according to the ship's officers and Dr. Frederick Haerer, one of the passengers, had not been visited by a supply ship for more than four months.

Distress signals, from the lighthouse, reading "We are starving" attracted the attention of the Mexico.


For Conscription in England-Government Prepares the Bill.

(Special to the Whig.) London, Jan. 4 .- The cabinet today put the finishing touches on the Government's conscription bill of 5, 011,441 men of military age in the United Kingdom. Only 2,829,261 enlisted during the Lord Derby recruiting campaign, it was announced today. Of those who failed to enroll, .378,071 are exempted from military service because of various important positions they now hold. This leaves 651,160 single men available.
