

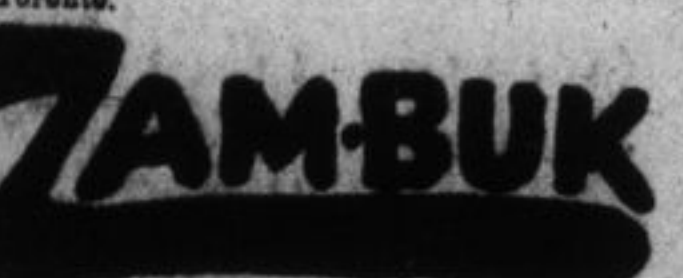

New York, Jan. 3.—The United States Steel Corporation has decided to offer to its employees for 1916, under the profit-sharing plan, 35,000 shares of the common stock at \$5.

Stock Dividends Taxable

Washington, Jan. 3.—The Government of the United States has ruled that stock dividends paid from net earnings of undivided profits are to be regarded as the equivalent of cash, and are taxable income under same conditions as cash dividends.

American Securities

New York, Jan. 3.—New York bankers estimate that American securities sold by Europe to this country since the outbreak of the war total \$1,550,000,000, of which Great Britain has sold \$900,000,000, Germany \$300,000,000, France, \$150,000,000, Holland \$100,000,000, Switzerland and other countries \$50,000,000.

Harvester Profit-Sharing

Chicago, Jan. 3.—International Harvester Co. announces a plan, which gives its 35,000 employees an opportunity to purchase profit-sharing certificates in the company, ranging from \$50 to \$1,000, which will be converted into stock at \$3 below the market value. To every employee who takes advantage of the offer before March 1st, 1916, the company will add to his payment one per cent. of his earnings annually.

Is Already Addressed As Emperor by The Chinese.

Peking, Jan. 4.—Yuan Shi-Kai, president of China, who has accepted the proffer of an Emperor's crown upon "request" of various elements in the nation, entered the palace in the Imperial yellow chair, sat on the throne and was announced as "His Imperial Majesty," at the New Year's Day reception given for Chinese officials. He is "already addressed as emperor by the Chinese," although the formal coronation ceremony has not taken place.
