**THE R. C. H. A. DRAFT REACHES ENGLAND**  
Steamship Metagama Arrives With Officers, Nurses and Soldiers.

Ottawa, Jan. 13.—The Canadian transport Metagama with various drafts and reinforcements aboard, totalling in all 134 officers, 27 nurses and 1,521 other ranks, has arrived safely in England.

**TEUTON ALLIES ATTACK**  
The British Lines in the Doloran Zone Monday.

Salonika, Jan. 13.—An important railroad bridge over the Struma river at Demir Hisar has been blown up by French engineers as a precautionary measure.

An attack by the Teutonic Allies on the Entente position has begun with the bombardment of the British lines in the Doloran zone, which lasted all Monday. The attacking troops include Bulgarians, Germans and Turks.

**FRENCH TROOPS**

**LAND ON CORFU.**  
Greek Island is Being Prepared For Arrival of the Serbians.

London, Jan. 13.—A French detachment has been landed on the Greek Island of Corfu for provisional occupation, according to an Athens despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company. Fourteen ships of unknown nationality are cruising around Corfu.

A Rome despatch to the Stefani Bureau says that Corfu advices report that a Yugoslav warship landed a detachment of troops on Tuesday evening in order to prepare for the arrival of Serbian troops.

Heavy cannonading was heard during the day from the direction of Dorian, across the northern Greek border, says a Havas despatch from Athens under Tuesday's date. Apparently an artillery duel was in progress, says the correspondent, but no official confirmation that this was the case was received.
