Good Market on Saturday.
There was a large market on Saturday morning, with the following prices prevailing: Beef, hinds, 10c to 11c per lb.; fore, 7c to 9c; pork, 12c to 15c a lb.; turkeys, \$1.75 to \$2.50 each; fowl, \$1.50 to \$2 a pair; chickens, \$1.50 to \$2 a pair; ducks, \$1.40 to \$1.60 a pair; butter, 33c to 35c a lb.; eggs, 40c to 45c a dozen; potatoes, \$1.65 a bag; apples, 40c a peck.
