In the United States 6,500 saloons were closed last year, and the slogan is a dry Republic in 1920.

Mr. McDermid then spoke of the encouraging progress of the cause in our own land. In our own Province of Ontario, he said, that in 1905 there were 187 dry constituencies, and 697 wet. In 1915 there were 542 dry and 305 wets.

PROMISED AMNESTY, BUT WERE MURDERED.

1,500 Armenians Put to Death—Men Bayoneted, Women Drowned.

London, Jan. 17.—Armenian refugees arriving at Erivan, Russia, Trans-Caucasia, state that 1,500 Sassanid Armenians were forced by cold and famine to surrender to the Turks under the Government amnesty, were killed by order of the Governor of Mush.

GOVERNMENT REVENUE THROUGH FARM CROPS.

Ten Institutions Save Province Seventy Thousand Dollars in Twelve Months.

Toronto, Jan. 17.—Crop raising at ten government institutions—Brockville, Kingston, Whitby, Guelph, Milton, Woodstock, London, Hamilton, Orillia and Fenelon—has saved the province \$70,000, according to returns at present in the hands of Provincial Secretary Hanna.
