The taste of chlorine in the water—or whatever chemical is used—is so strong that it is impossible, if not unfit, to drink it. Boiling does not remove the vile taste and consequently either tea or coffee is as bad as the water. ENGLISH AVIATORS
FELL 10,000 FEET.

Not Only Saved Their Lives,
But Also Their Machines.

Berlin, via wireless, Jan. 19.—Returning from the Bavarian prison at Ingolstadt, American Ambassador Gerard to-day brought a story of the miraculous escape from death of two English aviators, who fell 10,000 feet, and not only saved their lives, but their machines.

Captain William Wilson, Lieut. Schorleier, the two officers, were flying along the German front, when something went wrong with their biplane. The machine began sliding toward the earth at furious speed, and threatened to turn turtle.

By heroic efforts Wilson succeeded in righting her and started a voluntary earth.

It hit the earth with a terrific jar and both were thrown several feet. Wilson is suffering from concussion of the brain, but the Lieutenant was practically upright.

How Bulgaria Is Receiving Its Provisions.

Serbia, Jan. 19.—Aviators report that the Bulgarian army at Govgut is being provisioned from Vojvodina district, the supplies being carried on the shoulders of large bodies of peasants whose services have been commandeered for the purpose.
