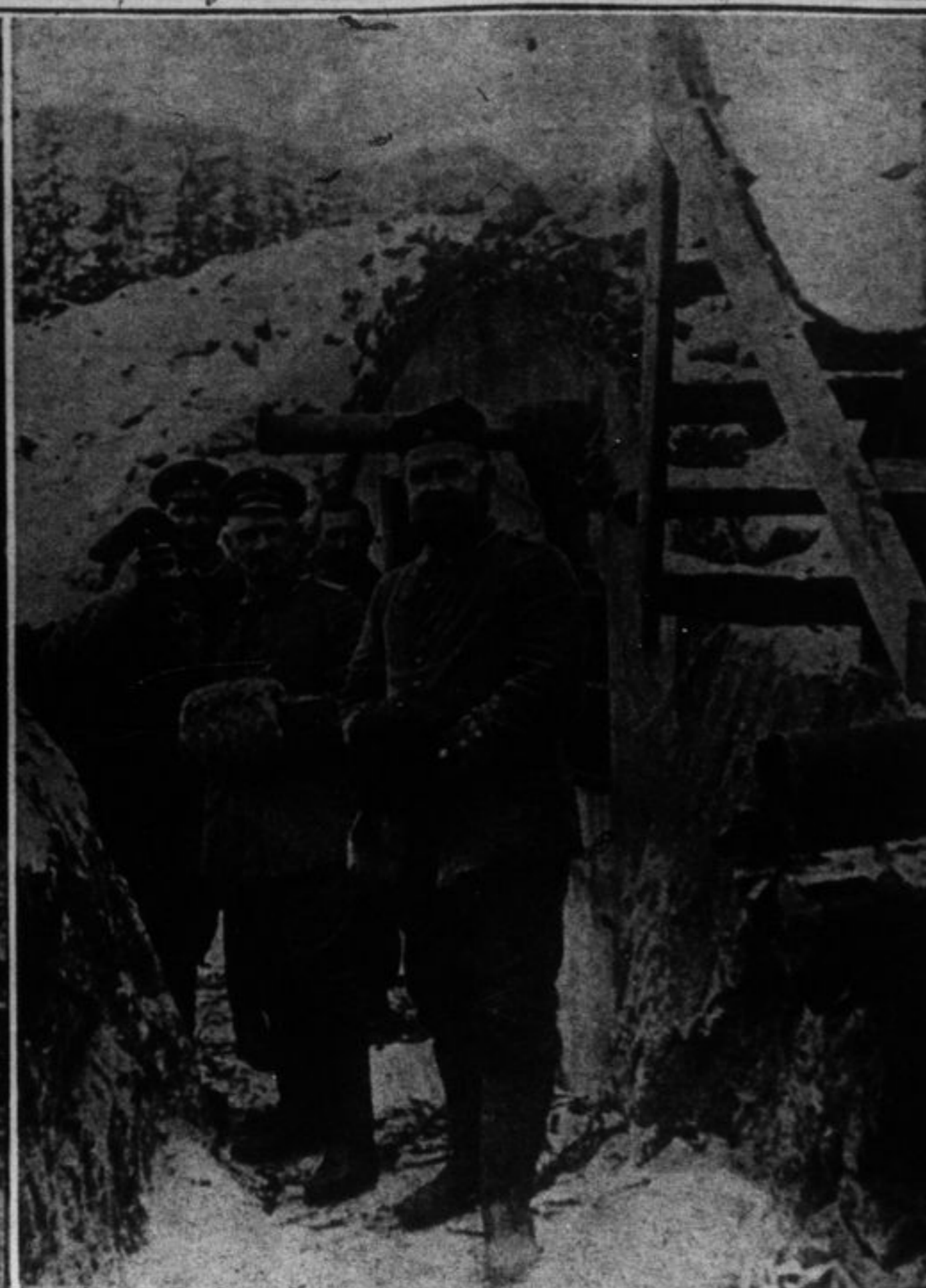




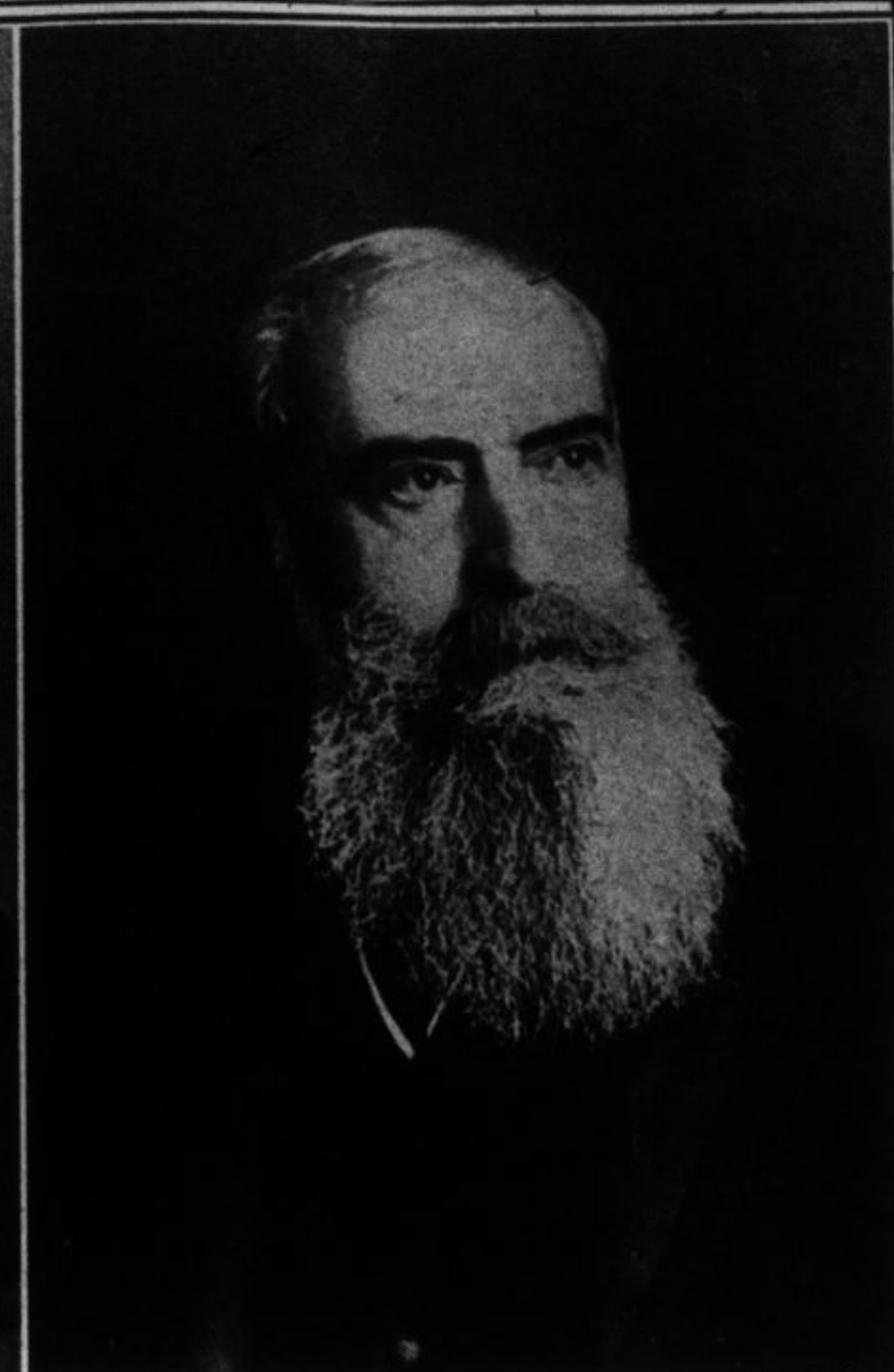

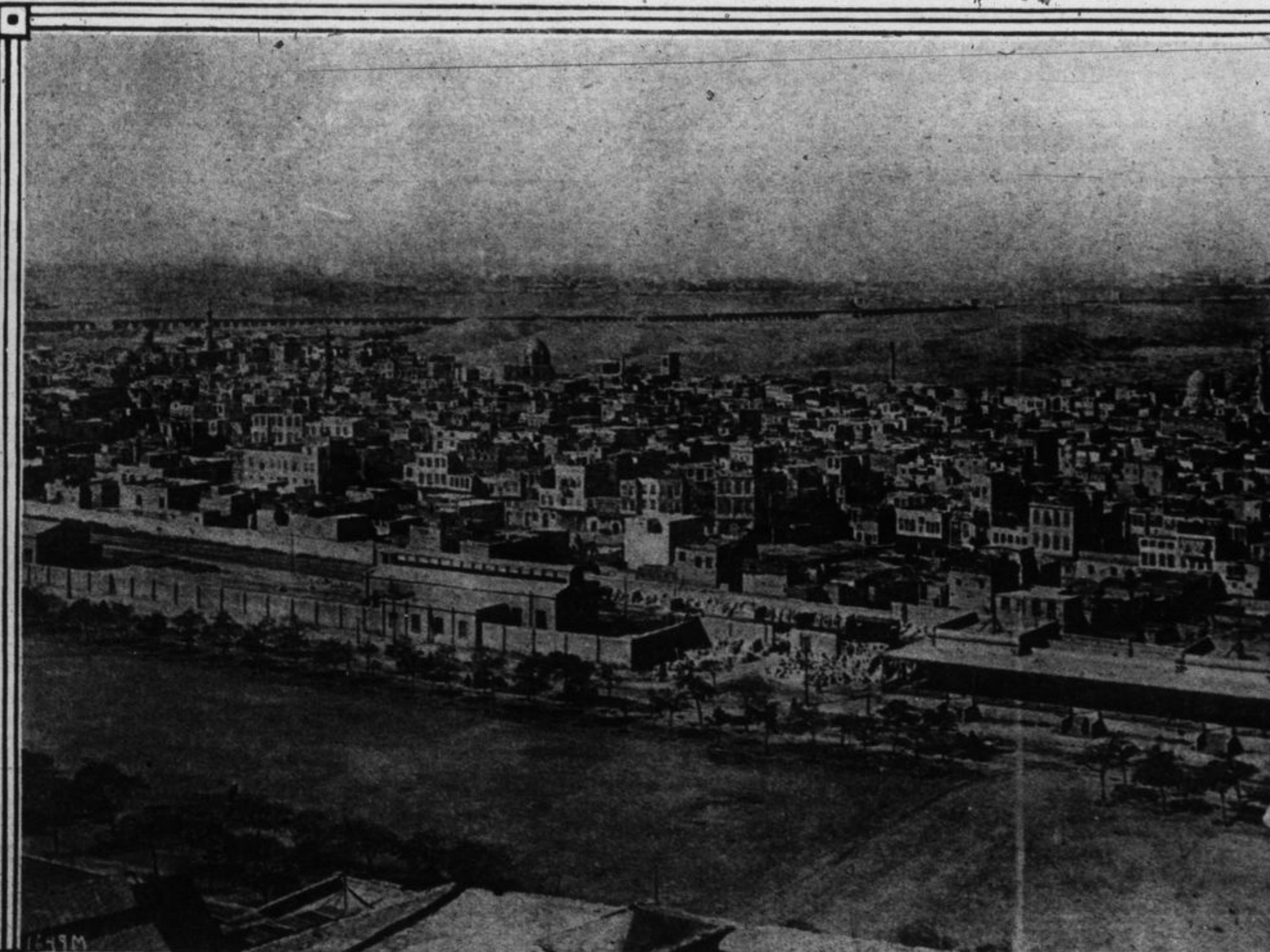
General Manoury, who succeeded Gen. Gallieni as Military Governor of Paris, a post held by Gallieni since the beginning of the war.



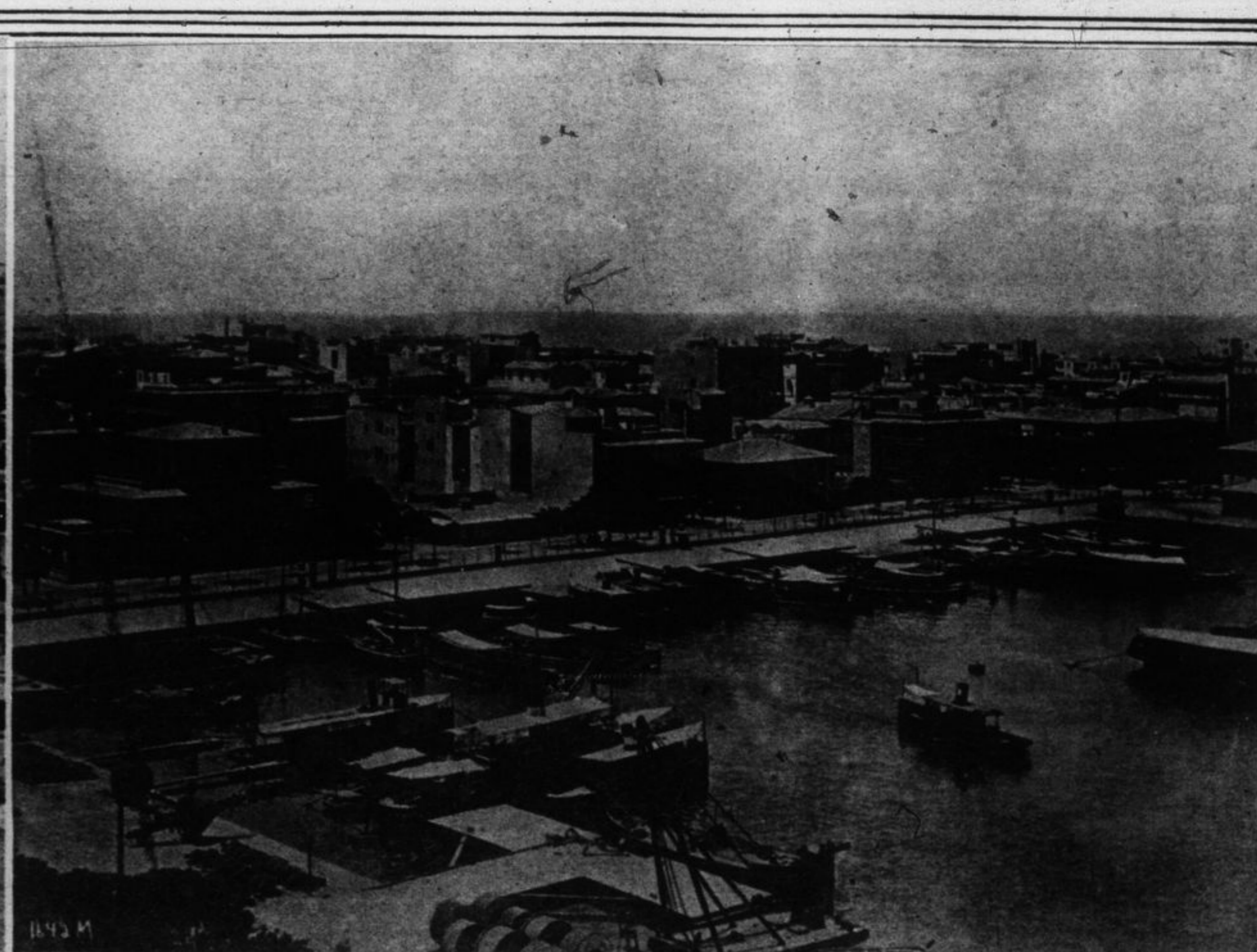
