Lieut. Roy P. Wilson, London, while at Kingston taking an officers' course, contracted typhoid fever, and has been confined to the General Hospital for the last few weeks. He is making a satisfactory recovery and hopes to be able to return home in a couple of weeks.

Rats in Trenches. There is a plague of rats along the British and French lines in Flanders and France. A soldier describes the invasion as "worse than the Germans," in a letter which adds: "The trenches, communications, fields, woods, cellars and barns are choked with them. We have them holding congresses at night in the busiest roads and giving concerts by day in the most crowded villages. We literally march on top of them. They breed and breed and launch themselves into assaults on the communications, like the Germans on the Yser, by battalions on masses.

"They are beginning to be tormented by hunger, and shortage of food makes them capable of anything. The other morning I saw a cyclist whose tires had been half destroyed by a platoon of rats. The other night some of our men had their surgical first-aid packages, which they keep in a coat pocket, attacked and carried off. Woe to the man who goes to sleep with a morsel of chocolate in his trousers! He will wake up to find himself without his trousers!"

The writer goes on to describe the methods of warfare that are being used against the new enemy, particularly some of the ingenious giant traps devised by the soldiers for catching the rats on a wholesale scale.

A Private Enquiry. Ottawa, P. M. Press. Now that such unpleasant publicity has been given to the alleged charges against the shell commission, it seems to The Free Press that there ought to be an inquiry open to Dr. Fugley and other critics; but we can see very strong reasons why the evidence submitted at that enquiry should not be made public before the end of the war.
