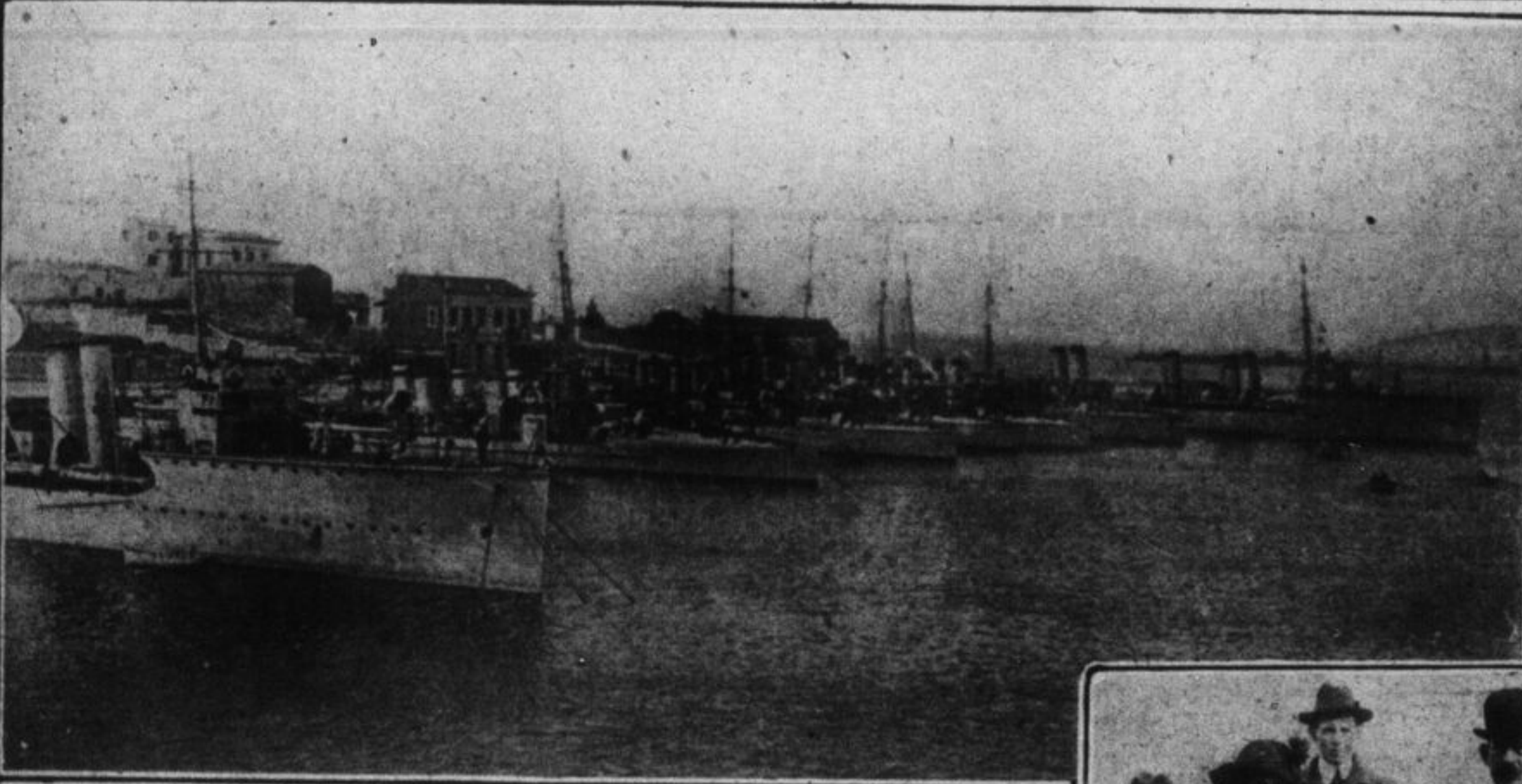
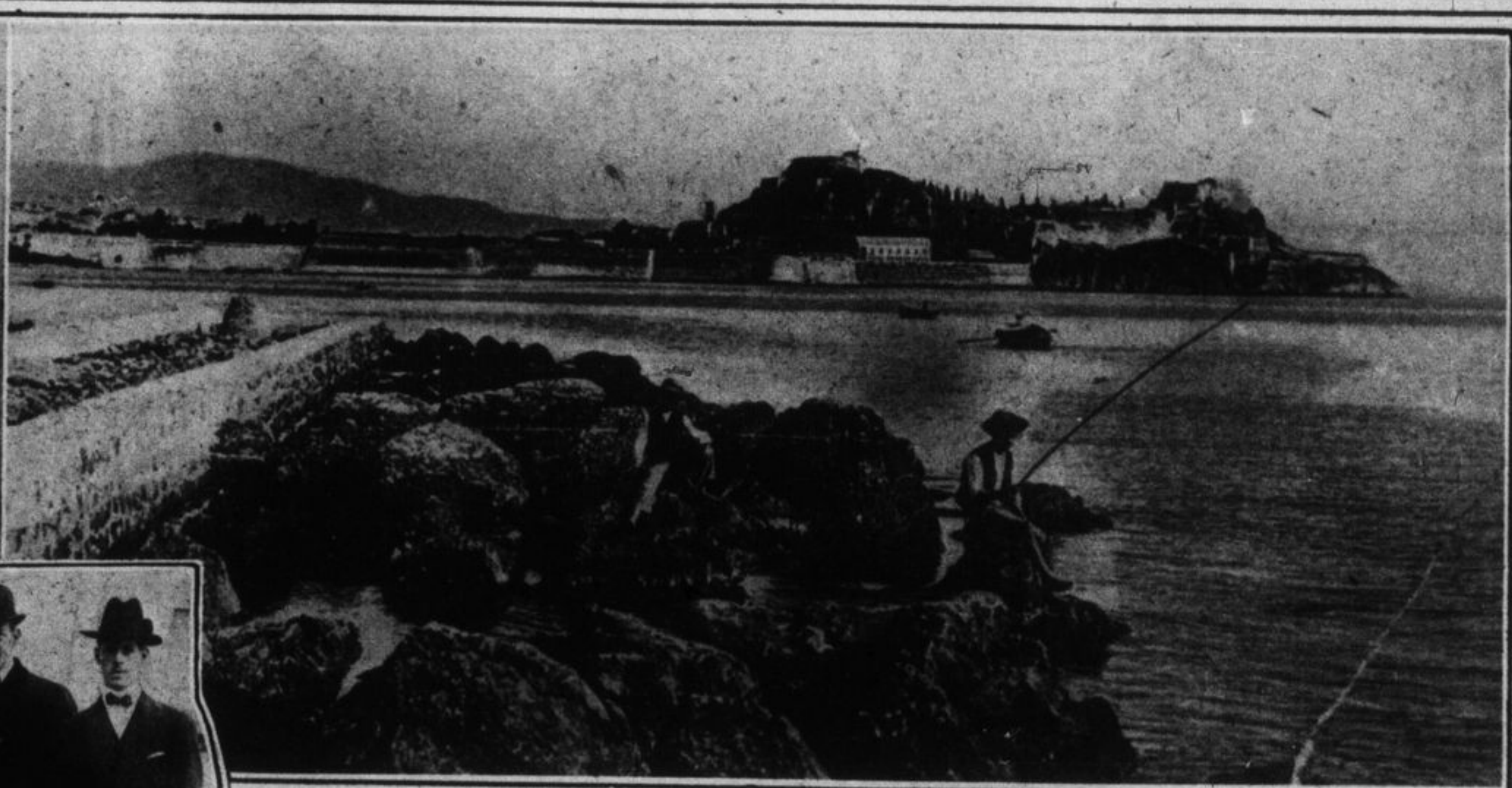

Greek torpedo destroyers, etc., anchored in the harbor of Piraeus, near Athens, where Allied troops are now landing.



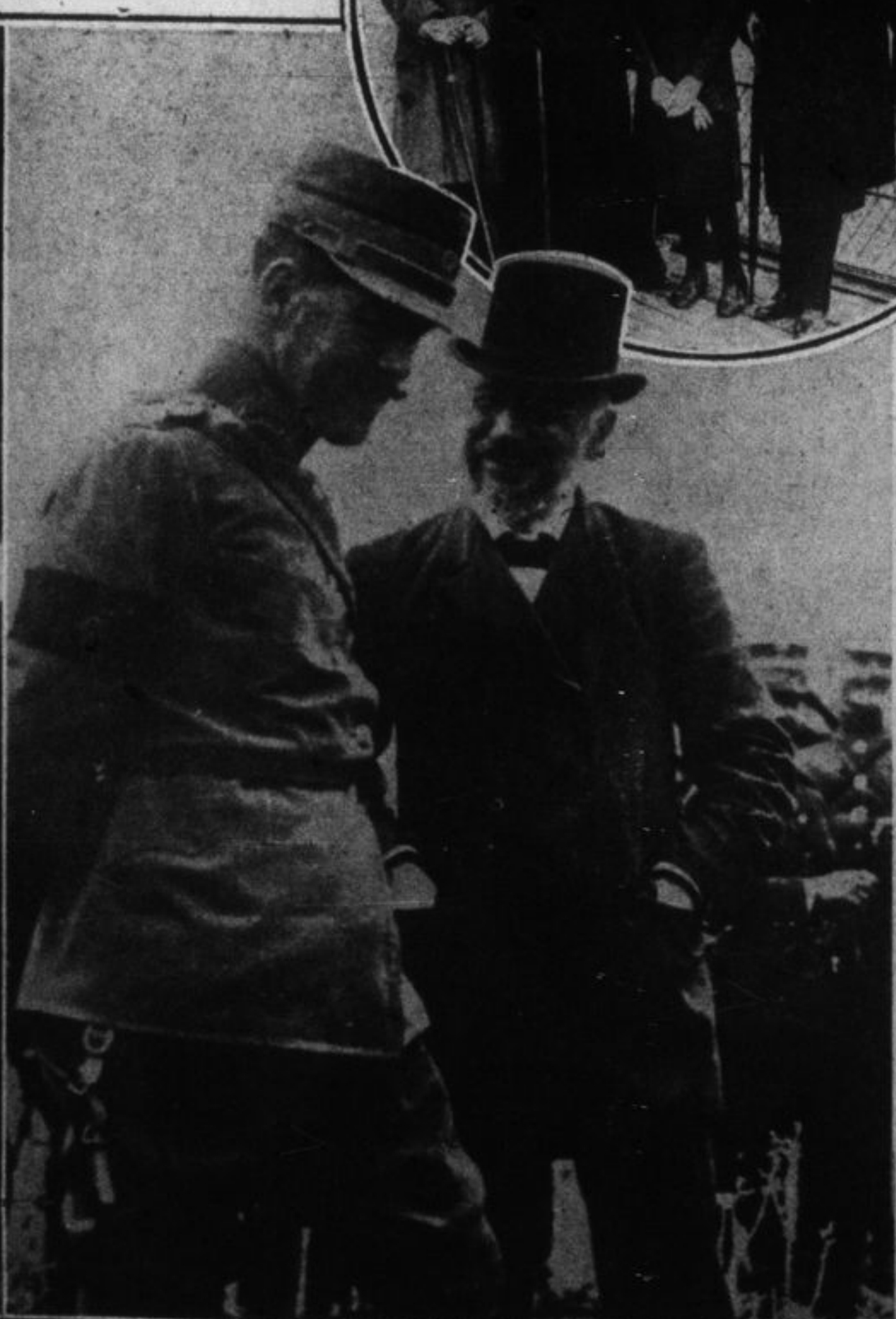
