

In an earlier message the United Press correspondent reported that the German people were a unit behind the Foreign Office in its handling of the German-American controversy, though he was not permitted at that time to state what policy the Foreign Office had adopted.

Pessimism at Washington.

Washington, Feb. 4.- Deep pessimism prevails in official circles over the latest communication from Berlin on the Lusitania question.

It is reported to-day that Secretary of State Lansing has received a report from Ambassador Gerard at Berlin, and has forwarded this to the President.

It is known that President Wilson will not yield in any particular in the demands he has made on Germany. It is known to be his belief that a crisis may develop with Germany on the Lusitania issue at any time the United States Government feels unable to "dicker" longer on the question, and some understanding must be reached this month.
