OVER 240,000 TROOPS RAISED IN CANADA.

January Figures Show Average of 1,000 Recruits a Day.

Ottawa, Feb. 11.—Recruiting figures for January show an average of practically 1,000 men per day for the full month.

Commanding officers of each division say that the men are enlisting now at a most satisfactory rate.

The continued keeping up of the flow of new men to the colors is all the more remarkable in view of the fact that up to the end of last year Canada had already enlisted about 210,000 men.

The total number recruited to date, including officers, is now over the 240,000 mark.

To the total number the 1st Military District (London) has contributed a little over 20,000 men, the 2nd District (Toronto) about 54,000 men, the 3rd District (Kingston) a little over 25,000 men, the 4th District (Montreal) about 22,500, the 5th
