GERMANY DECIDES TO NOW SIT TIGHT. On Conquered Territory and Make No More Offensive Land Moves.

(Special to the Whig.) Washington, Feb. 17.—In a recent speech, the Imperial German Chancellor indicated that Germany would make no more offensive moves on land but would sit tight, holding the territory conquered by her forces, with the intention of using her territorial gains as a basis for trading when peace negotiations were undertaken.

In making this announcement, the Chancellor was repeating the views of the German General Staff, which has concluded that it would be waste of men and money, without commensurate strategic gain, to take the offensive on land.

It is understood the purpose of the German Government depends mainly in the future on the activity of her submarines in harassing enemy commerce.

VIOLENT STORM ON WESTERN FRONT. Kept Troops in Trenches—Shelters Blown Down and Roads Flooded.

(Special to the Whig.) Paris, Feb. 17.—Violent storms along the western front last night not only impeded all artillery operations, but held the infantry to their trenches. The War Office this afternoon reported no change in the situation.

In Artois the wind and rainstorm reached its greatest violence. Shelters were blown down, trenches flooded and roads converted into seas of mud, impassable to auto trucks. Villages back of the front suffered severely in the storm.

GREAT ALARM FELT IN CONSTANTINOPE. Over Fall of Erzerum—Russians May Drive Towards Turkish Capital.

(Special to the Whig.) Athens, Feb. 17.—Great alarm is felt in Constantinople over the situation of the Turks at Erzerum. Large bodies of troops have been sent forward to combat the Russian advance. Fear is expressed in the Turkish capital that should Erzerum fall the Grand Duke Nicholas will repeat his feat early in the war of sweeping through Gallia by a great drive through Armenia toward Constantinople.

The news of the capture of Erzerum evidently had not reached Athens when the above despatch was filed.

MAY MOVE QUEEN'S HOSPITAL. From Cairo, Egypt, To Some Other Locality.

From information received in letters from members of Queen's Stationary Hospital at Cairo, Egypt, it would appear that the hospital is going to be moved to another place. The change is likely due to British abandoning the campaign at the Dardanelles.

It may be for that reason that Queen's reinforcements now waiting to leave for overseas service are being held until the hospital unit is settled in another war zone.

The other prices were: Beef, 8c to 11c a lb.; pork, 14c to 15c a lb.; turkeys, 22c to 23c a lb.; fowl, 16c to 18c a lb.; chickens, 18c a lb.; potatoes, 32c a bag; parsnips, 50c a bag; cabbage, 40c to 50c a dozen; butter, 33c to 35c a lb.; eggs, 35c a dozen.
